Dear Ms. Mills:

Burnett appreciates the time and attention the Department has given to its applications and looks forward to continuing these productive conversations as we move forward. As stated in the Department's comment letter dated December 20, 2021, the project is undergoing review by the National Park Service ("NPS") in accordance with their permitting authority for activities located within the Big Cypress National Preserve. The NPS has recently decided to conduct an Environmental Impact Statement ("EIS"), rather than an Environmental Assessment ("EA"), to address the potential impacts associated with Burnett's proposed project. For the reasons stated below, Burnett requests that its applications previously submitted to the Department be withdrawn until the project is further along in the design process to adequately assess the Department's permitting criteria. The specific applications that Burnett requests be withdrawn are listed below:

Prior to the NPS's recent decision, it was our understanding that the agency was going to conduct an Environmental Assessment, rather than an Environmental Impact Statement. Based on a tentative schedule provided by the NPS for that Environmental Assessment, the applicant believed that the project design was ready for review by the Department when the applications were submitted. However, conducting an EIS will entail a longer review period by the NPS, and potentially additional design changes.

Since the Department has indicated that it does not want significant changes to Burnett's application in the review process, and the new NPS decision increases the chance that such changes might occur in the coming months, we believe that withdrawing the applications to the Department, in order to allow the NPS's review to progress further, is an appropriate measure that ultimately should streamline the review for the Department when the applications are resubmitted.



Burnett appreciates the time and attention given to this matter and we look forward to resubmitting Burnett's applications with the Department as soon as possible.
