To be considered for the Service Project Award, your project should be completed or in progress by December 2022. Please provide a brief description of your service project and its impact on your community, using the attached form. Mail or fax the completed form to the address or fax number listed. The award will be given to the individual, group or organization whose project has had the greatest impact on their respective communities. The award will be presented at the Annual State of lowa, Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Ceremony in January 2023.
