OFFENSE: Theft

The victim's vehicles were parked in the northwest parking lot in the 0-100 Block of S Des Plaines River Road when the Unknown Offender(s) removed the catalytic converters from both and fled the scene. Both vehicles made unusually loud noises when starting just prior to discovering the converters were stolen.

Des Plaines Police were in the 1500 Block of Rand Road when they noticed three subjects walking southeast with one of the subjects, later identified as Alexandros Kanavos, drinking an unknown bright yellow liquid out of an iced tea bottle, noting the color of the liquid was inconsistent with that of the label. After Kanavos finished consuming the liquid, he discarded the empty bottle on the parkway and continued walking. The officer followed Kanavos and the other subjects, one of which was subject #2, Dustin McGuire, to the 400 Block of S Des Plaines River Road where he finally made contact advising that Kanavos was being stopped for a city ordinance violation. When requested for his identification, Kanavos provided an alternative name to that above which after running through the database came back with no file on record. The officer additionally asked if Kanavos had anything illegal on his person, at which time Kanavos produced a second similar iced tea bottle consistent in color with the

one the officer had seen him previously drinking from. Kanavos admitted the contents of the bottle was alcohol and also stated he had drug paraphernalia in his back pack. Although Kanavos had previously stated he did not have any identification on is person, the officer later found his Wisconsin ID card. That information was then run through the database producing a warrant out of the Palatine Police Department. PPD confirmed that the warrant was valid and active which was when Kanavos was taken into custody. McGuire's information was obtained and he was also asked if he had anything illegal on his person, to which he replied he also had drug paraphernalia in his back pack. McGuire was additionally taken into custody and he along with Kanavos were transported to the Des Plaines Police station. Once at the station, Kanavos was cited for the City Ordinance violations of Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, Illegal Deposit of Refuse and Open Alcohol in Public as well as possessing said Warrant while McGuire was cited for City Ordinance violation Possession of Drug Paraphernalia.

Des Plaines Police were dispatched to the 500 Block of E Oakton Street regarding a subject, later identified as Malik Daniels, who was trespassing on the property. When the officers arrived and spoke with the victim it was learned that Daniels had been at the restaurant for five hours the previous night playing loud music and disturbing customers. On today's date, Daniels returned to the business and had been inside for approximately two hours making the staff uncomfortable. The victim advised that they wanted Daniels to leave the property and for him to be warned he was trespassing. The officer made contact with Daniels and asked him several times to comply with the warning that he was trespassing on the property. Daniels refused to leave and was ultimately advised he would be arrested if he did not. Multiple more opportunities were presented to Daniels, who again, was refusing to leave when the officers told him he was under arrest. During the officers attempt to escort Daniels out of the business and place him in handcuffs, he continued to stiffen his arms, resisting the officers. Eventually, Daniels arms were detained and he was then transported to the Des Plaines Police station where he was later cited for City Ordinance Trespassing.
