Des Plaines Police were dispatched to the 1300 Block of Forest Avenue in reference to a vehicle stuck in the mud. When the officer's arrived, they observed the described black in color Hyundai SUV facing northbound off the roadway and was in fact in the mud. The officer's also made contact with a male who was attempting to leave the scene

on foot southbound from the location. The male originally stated that he was not involved but was attempting to help the subject, later identified as Grace Stack, dislodge her vehicle. The officers approached Stack and observed that she had bloodshot/glossy eyes and a flushed face. After asking Stack what had happened, she answered with slurred speech and a strong odor of alcohol emitted from her breath. Stack related that she was driving and got stuck in the mud, admitting that the male the officers had stopped was in her passenger seat. Stack was still seated in the driver's seat with the car in gear and only put it in park when the officer prompted her to. Stack admitted that she and the male party were drinking in a parking lot prior to driving. Given the physical indicators as well as Stack admitting to consuming alcohol, she was asked to perform a Standardized Field Sobriety Test. Stack agreed and upon completion, showed visible signs of impairment and was therefore taken into custody. Stack was transported to the Des Plaines Police station where she additionally provided a breath alcohol sample showing a BAC over two time the legal limit. Stack was subsequently arrested for Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol and DUI with a BAC Over .08 while receiving citations for Illegal Transportation of Alcohol by a Driver, Improper Lane Usage and the Operation of an Uninsured Motor Vehicle.

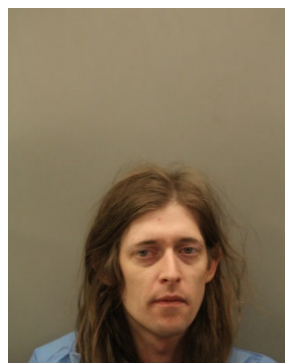
Des Plaines Police were on patrol in the 1300 Block of Miner Street when they observed the subject, Christopher Tate, exiting a business and begin walking eastbound towards the downtown area. Due to multiple previous incidents with Tate, the officers were aware that he had recently missed his court date. Tate's information was provided to dispatch who confirmed that he had a valid and active warrant. The officers checked the downtown area and located Tate near the area of Metropolitan Way and Miner Street. Contact was made with Tate and he was taken into custody. After being transported to the Des Plaines Police station Tate was subsequently arrested for said Warrant.

Des Plaines Police responded to the 1500 Block Rand Road regarding the report of a suspicious person. The caller advised that while opening a business they observed a male sleeping in the chairs outside of the entrance. When the officers arrived, they made

contact with the male subject, Daniel Farrell, and while speaking with him made the following observations: difficulty communicating, appeared disoriented and would frequently grunt and while being slumped over in the chair, Farrell was rocking back and forth. These observations lead officers to believe that he could possibly be under the influence of narcotics. Further attempts to communicate with Farrell were unsuccessful and the Des Plaines Fire Department was called to the scene. Farrell stood up and grabbed a nearby backpack and began walking and then running away from officers. Farrell entered the now unlocked business he was sleeping near, and locked the front doors to prevent officers from entering. Farrell ran up to the employees and began shouting at them when one employee unlocked the back door for officers to enter. The employee related that Farrell was threatening them, therefore committing the offense of assault. Once inside, the officers approached Farrell and attempted to take him into custody for the offense when Farrell swung at the officer nearest to him. Officers assisted Farrell to the ground in an attempt to control his movements and place him in handcuffs where he repeatedly resisted the officer's efforts and ignored commands. Additionally officers arrived on scene and was then that Farrell was able to be handcuffed and a search of his person and his backpack was conducting resulting in finding a container with a white rock-like substance and loose pills as well as multiple glass pipes used for ingesting narcotics. DPFDD arrived on scene and transported him to a local hospital while the officers interviewed employees of the business. It was then learned that after Farrell had locked the front door, he came up to the counter and began yelling at them for calling police. The employees felt threatened by Farrell's actions and felt as though he might strike them. The officers recovered all the items from Farrell and transported it to the Des Plaines Police station where they then tested the rock-like substance in a Narcotics Identification Kit. The test yielded a finding of methamphetamine in the substance. After being released from the hospital, Farrell was subsequently arrested for Possession of Methamphetamine, Resisting or Obstructing a Peace Officer, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, Disorderly Conduct and Assault.

Des Plaines Police were dispatched to the Rivers Casino located in the 3000 Block of S Des Plaines River Road regarding a subject on the property with an active warrant. When the officers arrived, they met with the security supervisor who stated that the subject, Joe Mitchell, has an active warrant out of the Illinois Department of Corrections and was currently on the casino floor. Mitchell was identified using his Rivers Casino players card being flagged by the Illinois State Police, who then notified security of his presence. Mitchell was currently using the slot machines nearest the east side entrance of the property when security escorted officers to that area. While doing so, dispatch confirmed with the officers that the warrant was valid and extraditable. The officers approached Mitchell and asked for his identification after informing him that there was a report he had a warrant in his name. Mitchell refused to provide officers with his actual information but instead provided officers with a completely separate name. While dispatch ran the identification, Rivers Casino confirmed that upon entry to the casino, the subject they were talking to had presented his Illinois Identification which verified he was Mitchell as well as the machine he was sitting at read "Joe Mitchell" due to his players card being inserted. Additional confirmation was made using Mitchell's facial features, scars and tattoos. Mitchell was asked to stand and was then taken into custody while being escorted to the west side entrance of the casino. A search of Mitchell was conducted prior to him being placed into a squad car resulting in the finding of Mitchell's identification stating he was in fact Joe Mitchell, a plastic bag with five white oval pills, a blue rectangular pill, and a plastic bag containing a white powdery substance. All items were removed from Mitchell's person and recovered by the officers on scene. Both the suspected narcotics and Mitchell were transported to the Des Plaines Police station. Once there, the pills were identified as Acetaminophen and Hydrocodone Bitartrate both listed as a schedule 2 drug as well as the blue pill being identified as Alprazolam, listed as a schedule 4 drug. Mitchell made no statements regarding any of the pills and was unable to provide a prescription for any of them. The white powdery substance was tested using a Narcotic Identification Kit which resulted in the positive finding of the presence of cocaine. Mitchell was subsequently arrested for three counts of the Possession of a Controlled Substance, one count of Obstructing Identification, and two counts of possessing a Warrant.
