Des Plaines officers responded to the area of Algonquin Road and Mount Prospect Road for the report of a vehicle crashed off the roadway. Officers arrived and observed a subject, later identified as Marilyn Nava, standing near the vehicle. As the officer spoke with Marilyn, he detected a strong odor of alcohol emitting from her breath, her eyes were bloodshot and

watery, slurred mumbled speech and had difficulty walking without staggering. When asked, Marilyn admitted to consuming alcohol prior to driving. She agreed to submit to Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and upon completion showed visible signs of impairment. She was taken into custody and transported to the Des Plaines Police Station. Marilyn agreed to provide a breath alcohol sample which showed a reading of almost three times the legal limit. Marilyn was subsequently arrested for DUI and DUI with a BAC over .08. She was also issued citations for Improper Lane Usage, Failure to Reduce Speed to Avoid an Accident and Operation of an Uninsured Motor Vehicle. She was cited and released with her court information.
