Officers responded to the Holiday Inn on the 3000 Block of Mannheim Road to assist with an unwanted subject. Upon arrival, officers spoke with the victim who related that an unknown male subject later identified as James Neish was sleeping in the lobby and refusing to leave. The victim related that the subject did not have a room at the hotel. The victim stated that when she asked Neish to leave, he started pushing her. She then pepper sprayed him and contacted 911 stating that he left the scene after that. The victim related she wanted to sign a complaint.

Officers located a subject matching the description walking inside a nearby gas station. Officers spoke with the subject and observed he had pepper spray all over his face. He was identified as James Neish and was uncooperative with responding officers. He was then taken into custody for battery. He was transported to the station where he was charged with Battery and released on bond.

Please remember that although a person may be charged with a crime, a charge is merely an Accusation, and the person is innocent until proven guilty.
