NOTEWORTHY INCIDENTS:

OFFENSE: Catalytic Converter Theft

A Des Plaines Police officer responded to a report of a catalytic converter theft at a hotel property on Touhy Avenue. Hotel management reported that a transport van had its catalytic converter stolen in the southwest lot during the early morning hours of February 27. The estimated damage was approximately \$2,000. Management also advised there had been a previous catalytic converter theft involving a nearby vehicle under a separate report number.

Des Plaines officers responded to a gas station on Wolf Road for a report of a theft involving prepaid fuel. The caller reported she had pre-paid for gas earlier in the day but had to leave due to an emergency. When she returned, she learned an unknown individual had used the prepaid fuel. She requested a refund, which the business declined. Officers spoke with the station employee, who confirmed the issue but stated he did not have access to surveillance footage, and the manager was unavailable.

Rosemont police also responded but did not locate the offenders. Officers checked the lot and found a Toyota Prius with its catalytic converter missing. The vehicle belonged to a guest visiting the hotel.

Officers observed multiple baggies containing a suspected controlled substance in plain view inside the residence. The substances later tested positive for the probable presence of heroin. Officers made contact with Tomasz again on 03/01/26 and placed under arrest for a failure to appear warrant out of Cook County. Tomasz was transported to the Cook County Courthouse for detention hearing. He was provided court information for the Possession charge.



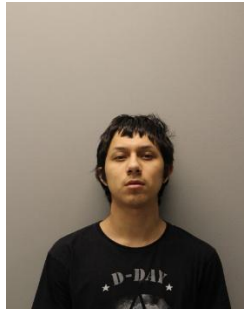

Des Plaines officers responded to a domestic-related call involving a financial dispute. The victim reported that his son, identified as Elvis Martinez-Bucio, had taken his phone and withdrawn \$80 from his bank account without permission. A few days later, officers returned to the residence for another disturbance involving Elvis damaging property inside the home. Upon speaking with the victim, officers confirmed he wished to sign complaints for the previous theft incident. Elvis was located at the residence, and officers placed him into custody. At the station, the victim provided banking documentation confirming the unauthorized withdrawal, and Elvis admitted to using his father's debit card information to obtain the money. The State's Attorney's Office approved one felony theft charge. Elvis was cited and released with a court date.

The driver of the vehicle, identified as Monica Marie Petrenko, showed signs of impairment, including watery/bloodshot eyes and a strong odor of alcohol. Monica stated she was attempting to drive to the gas station but did not recall striking anything. Witness video later confirmed that Monica made a left turn and struck a motorcyclist who was already traveling in the lane. Based on officers' observations, Monica was taken into custody for suspected DUI. She was transported to the station. Monica was charged with DUI and cited for Failure to yield and improper lane usage. Monica was released from custody with her court information.

Des Plaines officers responded to Rivers Casino regarding an intoxicated individual who was attempting to drive from the parking garage. Casino security identified the subject as Quentin Brown and reported that he repeatedly attempted to enter his vehicle despite being told not to. Officers made contact with Quentin and informed him he was no longer allowed on the property. Quentin refused to leave, remained in the driver's seat of his vehicle, and declined multiple opportunities to arrange transportation off the property. After continuing to refuse to leave and becoming verbally aggressive, Quentin was issued a citation for trespassing but would not sign it. Quentin ultimately continued to remain on the property, and officers placed him into custody. He was transported to the Des Plaines Police Department, charged with trespassing, and released with a court date.

One of the women involved, identified as Angelica Dunkines, was positively identified as a subject who struck both victims multiple times. It was also discovered that Angelica had a valid warrant out of Vermillion County. Video footage provided by casino security confirmed that Angelica repeatedly battered the two women without provocation. Angelica admitted to striking them. She was taken into custody, transported to the Des Plaines Police Department, and charged with two counts of battery and mob action. Angelica was provided with her court information and transported to the courthouse for her warrant.

Des Plaines officers responded to a report of a female damaging property at a residence on Curtis Street. Upon arrival, officers detained the involved subject, identified as Jasmin Duishbava, after she broke multiple windows of the residence by throwing rocks. Officers learned that Jasmin became upset over a relationship issue and damaged the windows along with a television and stand inside the home. Jasmin was taken into custody and transported to the station. After speaking with officers, Jasmin admitted to causing the damage. The State's Attorney's Office approved a felony charge for Criminal Damage to Property, and Jasmin will be transported for a bond hearing.

Des Plaines officers responded to a suspicious vehicle in a vacant lot on Webster Lane and learned the driver, identified as Jamal A. Ray, had been found unresponsive and transported to the hospital. A witness reported seeing Jamal driving slowly, turning onto Webster Lane, stopping, and then driving into a field, prompting her to call police due to concern for a possible medical emergency. Officers met with Jamal at the hospital and observed signs of impairment, including slurred speech, watery eyes, and the odor of alcohol. Jamal admitted to consuming a large amount of alcohol before driving. Officers obtained consent for blood and urine testing and later recovered alcoholic beverages from his vehicle. Jamal charged with DUI and cited for illegal transportation of alcohol and was released with a court date.

Officers later located John at the Des Plaines Public Library and attempted to speak with him, but he refused to answer questions. John was taken into custody, and the State's Attorney's Office approved a felony eavesdropping charge. John was charged with one count of felony eavesdropping and was provided with his court information and released.

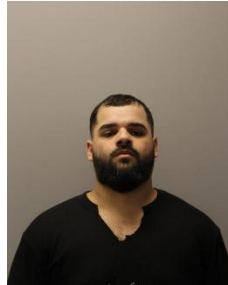
Des Plaines officers responded to a domestic battery in the 600block of Westmere Road. The caller reported being struck by his granddaughter, identified as Sydney Foley, during an argument. Officers observed injuries consistent with the caller's account. Sydney denied battering him, and other individuals on scene did not witness the incident. After officers provided Sydney an opportunity to leave the residence to prevent further conflict, she continued to be argumentative and refused to comply with officers' commands. When officers attempted to take her into custody, Sydney resisted by pulling away, falling to the ground, and kicking an officer. She was subsequently taken into custody and transported to the Des Plaines Police Department. Sydney was charged with domestic battery, resisting/obstructing a peace officer, and battery, and will be transported to the Cook County Courthouse for detention hearing.

With Isaac's consent, officers searched the vehicle and located pills identified as Xanax, for which Isaac did not have a prescription. Isaac later admitted the pills belonged to him. He was taken into custody, and the items were entered into evidence. Isaac was charged with possession of a controlled substance, possession of cannabis in a motor vehicle, and speeding. Isaac was released with his court information.
