These designers explored a curated selection of objects from the Center's vast costume collection, spanning from the early nineteenth century to the present day. From this selection, designers crafted their own unique interpretations.

Winners will be presented by Tommy Walton, faculty member of The School of the Art Institute of Chicago, cofounder of the design duo Price Walton and Reality TV Chef on FOX-TV's MasterChef Cooking Competition. Walton will bring an added dimension with his fusion of fashion design and culinary arts. The four first-place designs will receive a

cash prize of \$750 each and a gift card to Vogue Fabrics.

Opening Night guests will immerse themselves in an intimate fashion showcase, where featured designers will share insights into their fusion of history and contemporary design followed by a preview of the Center's new fashion exhibition. Guests will also have the chance to indulge in stylish refreshments while enjoying live music and the ambiance of the historic lakefront terrace.


