Why Compost Pumpkins?

1. They are full of nutrients that are good for the soil.
2. They are 90% water.
3. Most of the pumpkins processed in the United States are grown in Illinois—let's keep the water and those nutrients here.
4. Landfills are the 3rd largest producers of methane gas.
