REFORE THE REHAVIORAL

ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLAINT

Petitioner, the State of Indiana, by counsel, Deputy Attorney General Ryan P. Eldridge, pursuant to Ind. Code § 25-1-7-7 and Ind. Code ch. 4-21.5-3, brings this Administrative Complaint before the Behavioral Health and Human Services Licensing Board against the Indiana L.C.A.C. and L.M.H.C. licenses of Michael Hagedorn ("Respondent") for violations of Ind. Code § 25-1-9-4. In support, Petitioner states and alleges the following:

FACTS

Parties

- 1. The Office of the Attorney General ("OAG") is empowered under Ind. Code § 25-1-7-7 to prosecute this action on behalf of Petitioner against Respondent's license.
- 2. Respondent is a Licensed Clinical Addiction Counselor (L.C.A.C.) and holds license 87001568A, which was issued by the Board on August 1, 2016, and expired on April 1, 2024.
- 3. Respondent is a Licensed Mental Health Counselor (L.M.H.C.) and holds license 39003253A, which was issued by the Board on April 13, 2018, and expired on April 1, 2024.
- 4. Respondent's address on file with the Indiana Professional Licensing Agency ("IPLA") is 7006 Newburgh Road, Evansville, Indiana 47715.
- Another known address for Respondent is Michael Hagedorn, DOC # 954823,
 Reception Diagnostic (RDC), 727 Moon Road, Plainfield, Indiana 46168.

Jurisdiction

- 6. On or about January 18, 2023, the OAG received a consumer complaint filed against Respondent, and an investigation was then conducted as authorized by Ind. Code § 25-1-7-5(b)(4).
- 7. After investigation, the OAG determined that the complaint had merit, and, accordingly, a copy of the consumer complaint is being submitted to the Board herewith as Exhibit A.
- 8. The OAG having tendered a meritorious complaint, the Board has jurisdiction to hear this matter under Ind. Code § 25-1-7-5(b)(1).
- 9. Further, at all times relevant, Respondent was a "practitioner" as that term is defined by Ind. Code § 25-1-9-2.
- 10. As such, the Board has authority to hear this case and to impose any of the sanctions enumerated under Ind. Code § 25-1-9-9.

Respondent's Misconduct

- 11. On or about January 18, 2023, Respondent was charged with Dealing in Methamphetamine, Level 2 Felony in Vanderburgh County. The Affidavit for Probable Cause alleged:
 - i. Respondent was the owner of Now Counseling.
 - ii. Respondent sold narcotics to people who received counseling services through Now Counseling.
 - iii. Respondent was found at a traffic stop with a crystal substance in his vehicle identified as methamphetamine.

- iv. Respondent admitted to personal use of methamphetamine and that he "facilitated" drug deals for other people.
- v. During a search of Respondent's home, police found nine (9) firearms, body armor, 28.3 grams of marijuana, three (3) digital scales, and a handwritten ledger.
- vi. The ledger contained entries from \$800 to \$43,000, over multiple entries for different people that owed Respondent money.
- vii. Respondent informed the police that he kept money in a safety deposit box at a local bank.
- 12. On or about April 19, 2023, Respondent was charged with the additional counts of Dealing in a Narcotic Drug, Level 2 Felony; and Unlawful Possession of a Firearm by a Serious Violent Felony, Level 4 Felony.
- 13. On or about April 25, 2024, Respondent pled guilty to Dealing in Methamphetamine, Level 2 Felony; and Dealing in a Narcotic Drug, Level 2 Felony. The plea also involved a habitual criminal sentence enhancement.
- 14. On or about May 30, 2024, Respondent was sentenced to sixteen (16) years executed with the Indiana Department of Corrections.

CHARGES

15. Paragraphs one (1) through fourteen (14) are incorporated by reference.

Count 1 Conviction that Impacts Competency to Practice Ind. Code § 25-1-9-4(a)(2)(A)

16. Respondent's actions constitute a violation of Ind. Code § 25-1-9-4(a)(2)(A) in that Respondent has been convicted of a crime that has a direct bearing on practitioner's ability to

continue to practice competently as evidenced by Respondent's felony convictions for Dealing in Methamphetamine and Dealing in a Narcotic Drug.

REQUESTED RELIEF

ACCORDINGLY, Petitioner requests that the Board to issue an order against Respondent that:

- I. Imposes one or more of the disciplinary sanctions authorized by Ind. Code § 25-1-9-9;
- II. Directs Respondent to pay all of the costs incurred in the prosecution of this case, as authorized by Ind. Code § 25-1-9-15;
- III. Directs Respondent to pay a fee of Five Dollars (\$5.00) to be deposited into the Health Records and Personal Identifying Information Protection Trust Fund pursuant to Ind. Code § 4-6-14-10(b); and
- IV. Provides any other relief the Board deems just and proper.

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Addiction counselor arrested on meth dealing charge

EVANSVILLE, Ind. (WFIE) - The former owner of an Evansville addiction counseling center has been arrested on a meth dealing charge.

Evansville Police arrested 52-year-old Michael Hagedorn Thursday and charged him with dealing methamphetamine. A year ago, he stepped away from his position as agency director for Now Counseling in Evansville, offering addiction recovery services.

Police were surveilling 52-year-old Michael Hagedorn at a property he owns on Second Avenue. Evansville Police say they received tips that he was selling drugs there while offering counseling services. Police observed what they believed to be a drug deal, then pulled Hagedorn over after he left.

Police say he wouldn't cooperate at first, but they say after they found meth on the driver's seat, Hagedorn admitted to using it, as well as having more drugs in the car, at the house he'd come from, and at his home.

Police say it's not common for recently-arrested people to be so forthcoming.

"Certainly it happens, but not very often, so this is one of those times where for whatever reason he wanted to talk to the detectives and be honest and open about what was going on, and we certainly appreciate that because sometimes we have to do more digging," said Evansville Police Sergeant Anna Gray.

At Hagedorn's home, police say they found guns, body armor, marijuana, digital scales, and a hidden room with a safe and ammunition. Police say they also found hand-written ledgers showing the names of people who owed him as much as \$43,000.

At the Second Ave home police say they contacted 27-year-old Kyle Dersch and 25-year-old Sidnee Roberts, and charged them both with dealing drugs. Police say they also found meth, cocaine, fentanyl, heroin, and more.

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Police say it can be difficult to investigate people like Hagedorn, who at one time were a positive force in the community.

"We try not to judge people on who they are, and we treat everyone fair," said Gray. "And if someone is a role model in the community and they get caught doing something illegal, they're going to go to jail just as much as someone who maybe has a long criminal history."

The owner of Now Counseling says Hagedorn stepped away from the company to deal with family issues. They say it's hard for them to see what's happened with Hagedorn, but their focus remains on their work and the community.

They say they hope this helps people see how damaging addiction can be.

"This tells us, as a community as a whole, how real the disease of substance use disorder is, and how serious it is, and that as a community we should take that priority seriously and make sure that people have access to the services that they need," said Now Counseling Owner and Executive Director Jordan Milby.

Police say all of this started with anonymous tips, and they encourage people to reach out if they have any information that could help police in the investigation.

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
