

## KEYSTONE PARKWAY ROUNDABOUT ►

- The heavily traveled Keystone Avenue began its transformation into Keystone Parkway in 2008. This project included lowering the north/south road under the east/west road to separate traffic. It also included the construction of five full-access, double-teardrop roundabout interchanges followed by the completion of the 96th Street roundabout intersection. The transformation of this corridor has resulted in both environmental and safety benefits and provided greater connectivity for residents and visitors.



► **FRENCH HORN** - Mayor Jim Brainard is the son of a band director and began playing the French horn as a high school student in Elkhart, Indiana. In 2010, at the opening of The Center for the Performing Arts, Mayor Brainard played his French horn in a duet with Michael Feinstein, Great American Songbook Foundation Founder and Artistic Director of the Palladium.

## CARMEL CITY HALL ▶


**CITY HALL** - Built in 1990, Carmel City Hall is the seat of municipal government that houses the office of the Mayor and several of the City departments. The Carmel City Council and other civic and public meetings are held in the Chambers. The grounds at City Hall are adjacent to the Monon Greenway, the Japanese

Gardens and overlook the Minnie Doan Gazebo and greenspace used for hosting public events.



## MONON GREENWAY ▶

Formerly the Monon Railroad, the Monon Greenway is 5.3 miles of pathway through Carmel along which pedestrians and cyclists can access parks, dining and retail districts and enjoy public art. The trail connects Carmel with Indianapolis to the south and Westfield to the north giving residents and visitors a scenic and direct connection to amenities each community has to offer.



## THE CENTER FOR THE PERFORMING ARTS PALLADIUM ▶

Starting with a grand opening of the Palladium concert hall in January 2011, The Center for the Performing Arts has continued to be an exciting gathering place for the community to experience world-class entertainment. In addition to the 1,500-seat Palladium, The Center's campus includes the Tarkington Theater and the black-box Studio Theater. The Center is also home to the Great American Songbook Foundation.



## CARMEL ARTS & DESIGN DISTRICT ▶

Located in the heart of the City, the Arts & Design District is one of the Midwest's premier destinations for all things creative. Home to more than 200 businesses including galleries, restaurants, design showrooms, boutiques and creative service providers, the Arts & Design District also offers a wide variety of housing opportunities making it one of the city's most desired residential locations.



## FOUNTAIN AT CARMEL CITY CENTER ▶

The fountain, prominently located at the roundabout at Range Line Road and City Center Drive, serves as the northeast arrival to City Center, Carmel's downtown district. This walkable development features restaurants, retail, office suites and luxury residences. It is also the location of Hotel Carmichael, The Center for the Performing Arts and Carter Green, home to the Carmel Farmers Market, the Christkindlmarkt and The Ice at Carter Green.
