

Examples of American Rescue Plan Expenditures

The American Rescue Plan (ARP) grants are supplemental funding provided by the U.S. Department of Education and available to local educational agencies (LEAs) in the same manner as Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) Part B grants. This funding is for special education use only, and allowable costs mirror the traditional IDEA Part B 611 and 619 grants. These funds are available for use through Saturday, September 30. The list below are examples of how LEAs have expended the ARP funds under the non-tech, tech related and equipment categories:
