Highlights citing textual evidence, interpreting words and phrases in context, and determining central ideas and themes.



Represents a range of text complexity, including higher complexity associated with postsecondary readiness.



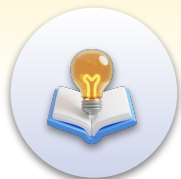
Craft and Structure (28% | 13-15 Questions)



The SAT School Day assesses the information and abilities necessary for understanding and using high-utility words and phrases in context, evaluating texts rhetorically, and drawing connections between texts that are thematically linked. IAS to prioritize are:

Information and Ideas (26% | 12-14 Questions)



The SAT School Day assesses the ability to locate, understand, and integrate information and ideas from informational texts and visuals (e.g., tables, bar graphs, and line graphs). It also assesses comprehension, analytical, and reasoning skills and knowledge. IAS to prioritize are:

Standard English Conventions (26% | 11-15 Questions)



The SAT School Day assesses the capacity to edit texts in accordance with the essential rules of Standard English use, sentence construction, and punctuation. IAS to prioritize are:

- 8.W.6
- 8.W.7
- 7.W.6
- 7.W.7
- 6.W.6
- 6.W.7

Expression of Ideas (20% | 8-12 Questions)



The SAT School Day assesses the capacity to modify texts in order to satisfy certain rhetorical objectives and increase the efficacy of written discourse. IAS to prioritize are:

- 11-12.W.1
- 11-12.W.2
