Since 1981, West Lafayette Tree Friends (WLTF) together with the City of West Lafayette has been dedicated to planting and maintaining street trees, ensuring a greener, healthier community.

## Our Impact in 2024

- 95 new trees planted (25 in spring, 70 in fall)
- 2400 street trees pruned
- Expanded efforts to protect and grow our urban canopy

### A More Engaging Annual Report

Our donor drive remains the heart of our fundraising. In 2024, we introduced a spring fundraising push and an updated, more visual annual report to better connect with supporters like you.

## Tree City USA Recognition

2024 marked our 33rd consecutive year in the program! We proudly partnered with West Lafayette Parks to install seven "Tree City USA" signs at major city entry points.

### Scaling Up Our Watering Program

Young trees need consistent care! Last summer, we launched a watering program with a 100-gallon tank, pump, and hose to support trees along sidewalks and trails. In 2025, we're expanding with larger tanks, longer hoses, and city trucks to reach even more trees. WLTF also co-funds watering bags to boost survival rates.

- Partnered with the GreenSpace Team on an IDNR Community & Urban Forestry Assistance Grant



For the past three years, Dennis and Sharon Schlott have generously opened their home for this event, creating a warm and welcoming space for us to connect and express our heartfelt gratitude.


With 40 wonderful attendees, the evening was filled with great conversations, appreciation, and a shared passion for growing a greener West Lafayette.


## Communications/Urban Leaves - Cliff Sadof

## **Tribute Tree Program Update**

The West Lafayette Tree Friends continue to honor and celebrate those who have made a lasting contribution to our community.

This year, Tree Friends proudly recognized Judy Pellissier and Bryce Patz for their unwavering dedication and countless hours of hard work in support of West Lafayette Tree Friends. Their passion and commitment have made a lasting impact, and we are deeply grateful for all they have done.

Five other Tribute Tree donations were made by private individuals. All seven trees will be planted in Spring of 2025.

While no new Tribute Trees were planted in 2024, we are grateful for the continued support that allows us to fund future plantings.

With newly funded trees included, the <u>total number of Tribute Trees now</u> <u>stands at 72</u> each serving as a living testament to the individuals they honor.

We also extend our heartfelt appreciation to Suman Harshvardhan who has dedicated time and effort to the Tribute Tree Program. In September, Lise Schools stepped into the role of Tribute Tree Coordinator, ensuring this meaningful program continues to grow and flourish.

## **Green Space**

2024 brought significant changes to the City's urban forestry program with the departure of Bryce Patz a key leader and advocate. To meet growing needs, the City hired Green Space Administrators Jennifer Gardiner and Brandon Hall, with John Muller stepping in as Interim Administrator.

## Tree Friends Highlights:

- Sponsored an IDNR Tree Stewardship Program in April, covering planting, pruning, pest management, and tree ID.
- Launched the first street tree watering program, watering 350 trees over seven times during dry weeks.
- Contributed 726 volunteer hours across 13 pruning sessions, with Tree Friends, AmeriCorps, Purdue students, and City staff pruning over 2400 young street trees.

## **Operation ReLeaf:**

- West Lafayette Tree Friends and the City of West Lafayette together
  planted a total of 95 street trees, primarily in neighborhood areas.
  Additionally, Bennett's Greenhouse generously donated 12 trees in the fall of
  2023. Of these, four were planted at Blackberry Farms in the fall, and the
  remaining eight were planted in the spring of 2024 in celebration of Arbor
  Day. We're grateful for their support in growing our urban canopy!
- We also continued offering the resident-requested street tree application.
- Continued offering the resident-requested street tree application.
- Removed 25 trees from public rights-of-way.
- Expanding Our Impact:

A \$25,000 CUF Grant, match by \$11,000 from Tree Friends, will fund the planting of 25 trees annually in 2025 and 2026. Special thanks to Carl Huetteman and Racheal Bingaman for securing this funding. Additional investments include essential tools, safety signage, pruning equipment, and watering bags.

### **Upcoming Training:**

- Spring 2025: A 2-day tree pruning seminar led by Lindsey Purcell.
- Spring 2026: IDNR training on tree planting and maintenance.

Together, we're strengthening West Lafayette's urban canopy and ensuring a greener future.
