PROCLAMATION
BY THE
GOVERNOR

TO THE PEOPLE OF KANSAS, GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, on Sunday, February 11, 2024, Super Bowl LVIII will take place in Las Vegas, Nevada, featuring the Kansas City Chiefs and the San Francisco 49ers; and

WHEREAS, the Kansas City Chiefs will make their fourth Super Bowl appearance in five years, triumphantly returning for the second straight year following their sixth straight AFC Championship game with Patrick Mahomes as starting quarterback; and

WHEREAS, the Chiefs-49ers matchup will be a rematch of Super Bowl LIV in 2020, in which the Chiefs came back from a 10-point deficit in the fourth quarter to win the game, bringing home their first Lombardi Trophy in 50 years; and

WHEREAS, tight end Travis Kelce and teammates will be fighting for their "right to party" with a victory, as Kelce exclaimed after winning Super Bowls LIV and LVII; and

WHEREAS, the team has the chance to become one of a few to win back-to-back Super Bowls, solidifying dynasty status under the leadership of head coach Andy Reid and company; and

WHEREAS, the Chiefs are beloved and celebrated throughout Kansas and across the world as Chiefs Kingdom knows no boundaries with traditions such as Red Friday, in which fans show out in their best Chiefs gear each Friday during the NFL season in support of the forthcoming game; and

WHEREAS, in anticipation of the Super Bowl, a sea of red for the Chiefs will cascade across Kansas and the nation, welcoming anyone to cheer alongside the fans verified by Guinness World Records as the loudest in the world; and

WHEREAS, as will be echoed throughout Chiefs Kingdom, "are you ready for it?"
