Recognition Categories



Energy Efficiency Plus Health: Recognize schools and districts that have implemented retrofits, performed building assessments or planning in preparation for retrofits, with the goal of providing an energy-efficient and healthy learning environment.



Emissions Reduction and Resilience: Recognize schools and districts that have implemented strategies, or identified pathways and planned activities, with the goal of reducing emissions and improving resilience.

Two Ways to Gain Recognition



Planning Track: Participating schools and districts will complete a 3-part webinar series (Jan-Mar 2023) to learn about assessment tools and get assistance in planning activities. Schools must complete a final plan describing how topics covered in the webinars inform decisions to improve their school facilities.
