"Canoemobile" back for 6th year

Fun and exploration on the Ohio River Oct. 3-7

The Canoemobile will offer trips from 10 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. at Shawnee Park on Friday, Oct. 6 & Riverview Park on Saturday, October 7th.

The "Canoemobile" is making its annual stop in Louisville on October 3-7, bringing fun and exploration through free trips for all ages on 24-foot Voyageur canoes on the Ohio River. The program, locally in its sixth year, is organized by Louisville Parks and Recreation's Natural Areas Division based at Jefferson Memorial Forest in partnership with Wilderness Inquiry, Inc. of Minneapolis.

The Voyageur canoes are safe, stable and can carry 9 participants per trip. Safety equipment and trained staff will be provided. Organizers suggest wearing comfortable outdoor clothing that can get wet, but no flip-flops. Water coolers will be available, so bring a refillable water bottle. Food also will be available for purchase. Pre-registration is not required, and all trips will be offered on a first-come, first-served basis. Trips will leave every 30 minutes. All participants must sign a waiver, and those under the age of 18 must have a waiver signed by a parent or legal guardian. Forms can be found at memorialforest.com.

Free Services Offered to Local Homeless Population on October 4th

Louisville's homeless population will have an opportunity to access services, information and assistance in a one-stop environment at **the 2017 Project Homeless Connect/VA Stand Down, on Wednesday, October 4th**. Resources available at the event will include food, clothing, medical evaluations, help with employment, education and benefit services and many other forms of assistance.

The event takes place from **8:30 a.m. to 2 p.m.** (entry doors will close at 1 p.m.) at **The Salvation Army (Old Male High School) campus** located at [911 S. Brook St.](#) in Louisville. Several TARC buses will provide access throughout the day from emergency shelters to the event site. The event is coordinated by the Robley Rex Veterans Affairs Medical Center (VAMC), Louisville Metro Office of Resilience and Community Services, Coalition for the Homeless and other community partners including The Salvation Army.



The Project Homeless Connect/VA Stand Down (PHC/Stand Down) is an annual one-day community outreach project where representatives from community service organizations come together to address the collective needs of the homeless during a single visit. This event is made possible by the work of hundreds of volunteers and resources from the Robley Rex VAMC, Kentucky Department of Veterans Affairs, Louisville Metro Government, Coalition for the Homeless, and Louisville Metro Council.

The latest numbers from the 2016 Homeless Census indicate 6,373 individuals were homeless at some point in Louisville last year -- either on the streets, in homeless shelters or accessing services through Louisville's homeless service providers. A variety of factors can lead to homelessness and often these individuals may be victims of domestic violence, disabled, veterans or senior citizens.

At last year's event approximately 560 persons participated receiving a variety of individual services including State of KY ID cards, flu shots and other medical exams and services, housing linkages, mainstream benefit access (SSI/SSDI), clothing, food and general case management services. The "Stand Down" event, named for the military concept of renewal, personal care, etc., is replicated from a national service delivery model that has proven to be crucial in eliminating barriers to housing, employment, education and the myriad of other factors that contribute to long-term homelessness.

Offered again this year will be a foot-washing service provided by community volunteers and the Coalition for the Homeless. Many individuals experiencing homelessness have issues with their feet due to diabetes, frostbite and other exposure issues. Every participant at Project Homeless Connect/Stand Down will be invited to soak their feet and have them examined by medical volunteers. Members of Louisville Metro RSVP (Retired and Senior Volunteer Program) is also leading a sock and towel drive so that each participant can leave with new socks and healthier, cleaner feet.

\$30 Million Indoor Track and Field Facility to be Developed on Heritage West Site *Louisville Urban League selected as development partner*

The Louisville Urban League has been selected to develop a state-of-the-art multi-sports complex anchored by an indoor track and field facility on the **24-acre Heritage West** property located at **3029 W. Muhammad Ali Blvd.**

The complex will be designed to host a variety of sporting events potentially sponsored by organizations such as USA Track and Field (USATF), the National College Athletics Association (NCAA), colleges and universities, and local and regional public and private schools. The facility also will feature retail space and related amenities.

The total project cost is expected to be \$30 million. Heritage West is located on the western border of the Russell neighborhood, which is currently seeing unprecedented levels of investment, including the \$29.5 million mixed-income, mixed-use redevelopment of Beecher Terrace, a project expected to leverage at least \$200 million in new investment; Waterfront Park Phase Four expansion; relocation of Passport Health Plan's headquarters; and construction of a new YMCA at 18th and Broadway.

The city began the Heritage West redevelopment process in March, when it issued a Solicitation of Interest that drew four innovative and exciting proposals, one of which was eventually withdrawn. More than 125 public comments were received on the four proposals. The West Louisville Community Council (WLCC), a grassroots organization of residents, neighborhood associations, places of worship, educational and cultural institutions, focused on responsible, citizen-engaged redevelopment of vacant and abandoned properties in west Louisville, has been a key partner throughout the review and engagement process.

The WLCC has co-hosted community visioning meetings and public review meetings for the Heritage West Property, and sponsored an art contest that led to the renaming of the site as **"Heritage West."** To read more about the project, visit https://louisvilleky.gov/sites/default/files/advanced_planning/lul_track_presentation6.15.17.pdf
