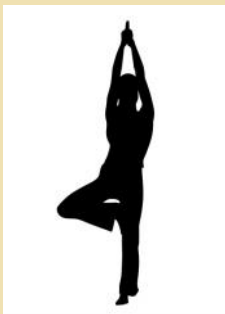

Effective Tuesday March 06, 2018: Louisville Metro's funding for the Home Repair program have been exhausted due to an unprecedented volume of applications. As such, **the Office of Housing and Community Development (OHCD) will not accept applications for the Home Repair program until further notice.** The Home Repair program uses Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds provided by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). Because of the unusually high number of applicants, applications are unable to be processed until additional funds become available.

The CDBG program provides grant assistance to qualified applicants for necessary repairs that protect the health, safety, and welfare of the household and the immediate habitability of the home.

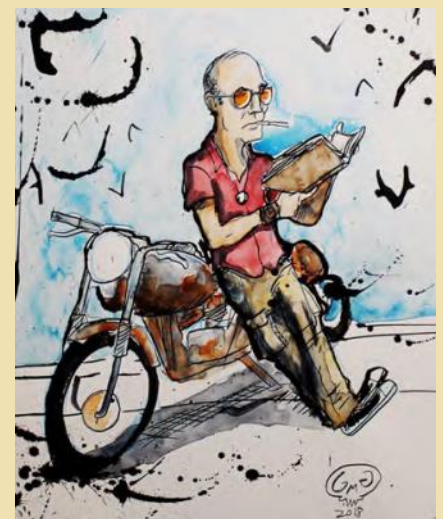

### Free Tax Preparation for Louisville Residents

There are **free tax preparation sites across Louisville** that will provide federal and state income tax assistance to eligible residents **VITA and AARP volunteers** available at sites across Louisville also will help residents determine eligibility for Earned Income Tax Credit.

Louisville Asset Building Coalition's Volunteer Income Tax Assistance, or VITA, and AARP Tax Aide programs provide trained, IRS-certified volunteers to offer free tax services at **more than 20 sites across the city**. The service is available to individuals and families who earned less than \$64,000 in 2017.

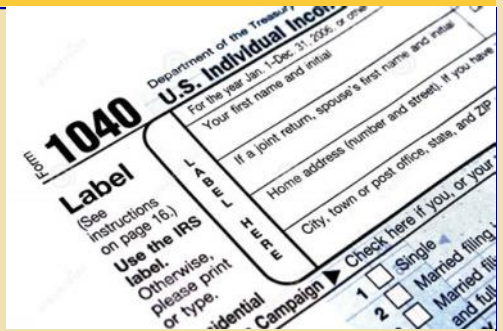
