BLOCK MONITORS TO TACKLE TRASH



Concern about the lack of cleanliness of sidewalks and alleys on Second Street initiated a discussion at the Board of Directors meeting on

Jan. 13. We recalled that once before, in 2014, we faced the same problem, so the SSNA set up a system of block monitors that solved the problem. The Board has now decided to revive the same arrangement.

Each block will have two monitors, one for each side of the street. The duty of the monitor is to walk the sidewalk and the alley of the assigned block and pick up trash at least twice a week. Monitors are also encouraged to look for problems that need to be reported to MetroCall 311, such as excessive trash and large items at any one address, problematic condition of the alley, sidewalk, or buildings, damaged trees and so on.

In 2014, we found that after a couple of weeks, perhaps seeing that neighbors were picking up the trash, persons—residents especially—weren't so eager to throw trash in the alleys and on the sidewalks. It became less necessary to take the walk twice a week as the situation improved—until now.

The Board would like to hear from the membership and especially hear from anyone who is eager and willing to assume responsibility for a block. The block from Ormsby to Magnolia is very long. In 2014 it was divided into two. But one person can quite easily managed the other blocks.

Of course, social distancing and wearing masks and protective gloves is expected of all participants, but just think: it would be a chance to greet your neighbors, get some exercise and exert a very positive influence on the neighborhood.

COMMUNITY GARDEN STARTING UP



Soon it will be time to start thinking about starting seedlings for planting outside. Just think: starting seeds indoors in

February for nice early crops of broccoli, cabbage, kohlrabi, and cauliflower. And soon after that, seeds in the ground for future harvests of lettuce, spinach and other vegetables.

The Old Louisville Community Garden will be checking with last year's gardeners to find out if they intend to continue gardening and will be taking reservations for any beds that come open. This year's fee will be the same as it has always been: \$25, which covers the cost of water for the whole season. Gardeners must sign an agreement, agree to help with some of the maintenance, and in this COVID era, bring their own tools. We will observe social distancing and require wearing a mask, but on the whole, it's a pretty laid-back scene.
