



DEATH RATE FOR BLACKS BY AGE SHOWS HEALTH INEQUITIES FOR CERTAIN AGE GROUPS












VACCINATION EFFORTS FOR WEST END RESIDENTS

- Vaccination Sites Placed in West End Neighborhoods (see Appendix)
- Targeted Vaccine Events in Partnership with Hospital Systems and Black Faith Leaders
 - Over 20 Church events held
 - Several co-sponsored community events (African-American Heritage Center, Urban League, Newberg Community Center, Hope Wellness Center)
- Mobile Vaccination Events Launched
 - Phase One: Targeted populations with access barriers and equity focus. Over 30 mobile events to date (homeless, corrections, addiction treatment, low-income senior housing, homebound seniors, immigrants, others
 - Phase Two: Partnership with Community groups to co-host vaccine events with Hospital partners, Community Health Centers and DPHW
- Direct Phone Registration to Overcome Computer Access Barriers

- Communications Workgroup
- Paid Media and Ad Campaigns
- Expert Panels with Black medical leaders in Community Forums (dozens held).
- Research on Vaccine hesitancy and effective targeting messaging strategies
- Paid partnerships with community organizations for community outreach
- We need the help of community organizations:
 - Outreach/assistance to register and bring people to vaccine events
 - Communication from trusted leaders to answer questions and overcome hesitancy
 - Co-host vaccine events.
