About the instructor: Kayla Morgan was born and raised in the West End of Louisville, Kentucky. She has been creating art since she was 9 years old when she first began attending Louisville Visual Art's CFAC classes. Since 2019, she has been a full time artist. Kayla explains her art to be "emotional black concept art" expressed through the mediums of acrylic paint and mixed materials. In 2021, Kayla began teaching, sharing her love and knowledge of art from children to adults. She has taught at The Black Excellence Recharge, Liberated Minds Homeschool Academy of Louisville, and Change Today Change Tomorrow Education Center. Kayla also is the President of WhoDontLoveArt, an art business she founded with Ci'Vaughn Green.
