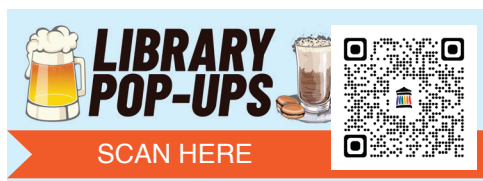


LFPL's Adult Winter Reading Program runs through February 28

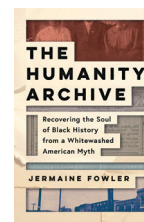

Cotter Cup Storytelling Contest

In 1913, renowned Louisville educator and poet Joseph Cotter created a storytelling contest for kids at the Western Library that became known as the Cotter Cup. In 2021, the LFPL brought the Cotter Cup Storytelling Contest back to Western. Open to all Louisville students, grades K-12, the contest now focuses on storytelling through poetry.

To participate, students are required to participate in a one-on-one consultation with a tutor from the University of Louisville Writing Center. UofL Writing Center staff will work with students to help them structure their writing and develop new skills to complete their poem. Participants will enter their finished piece for judging by April 1. Final poems should not exceed 1,000 words.

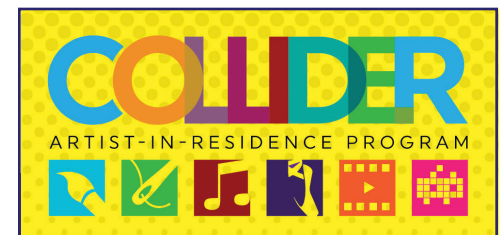
