


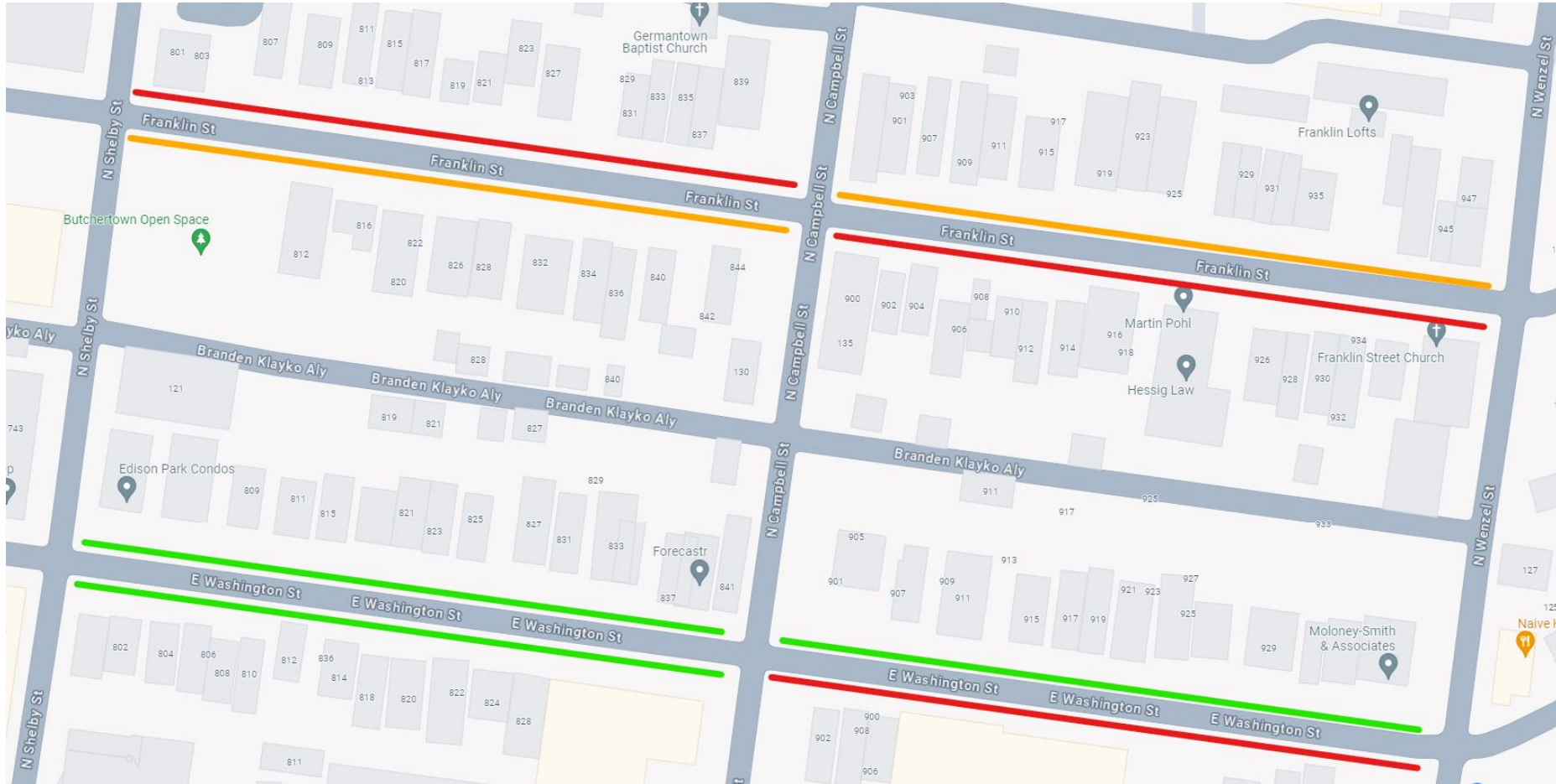


Butchertown Residential Parking Permit Program

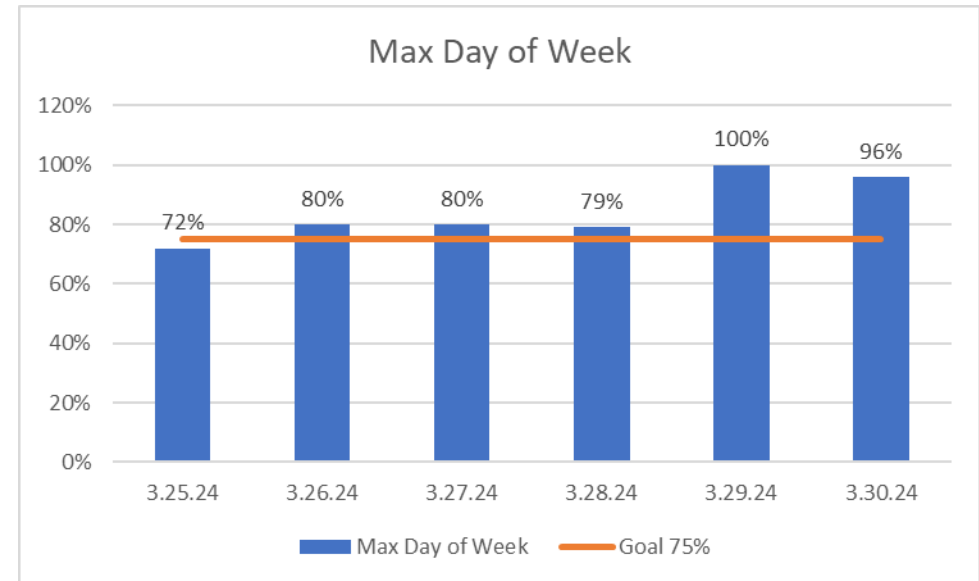
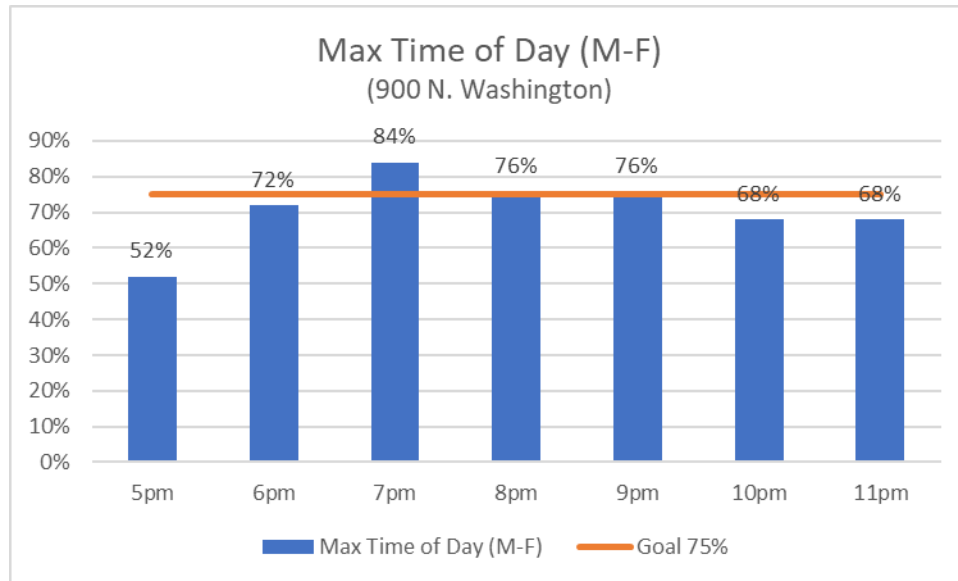
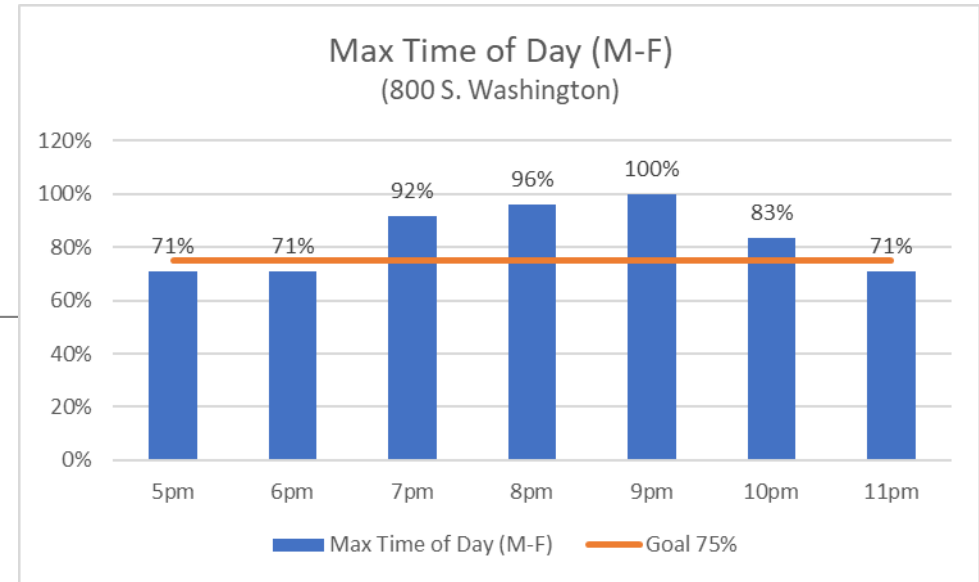
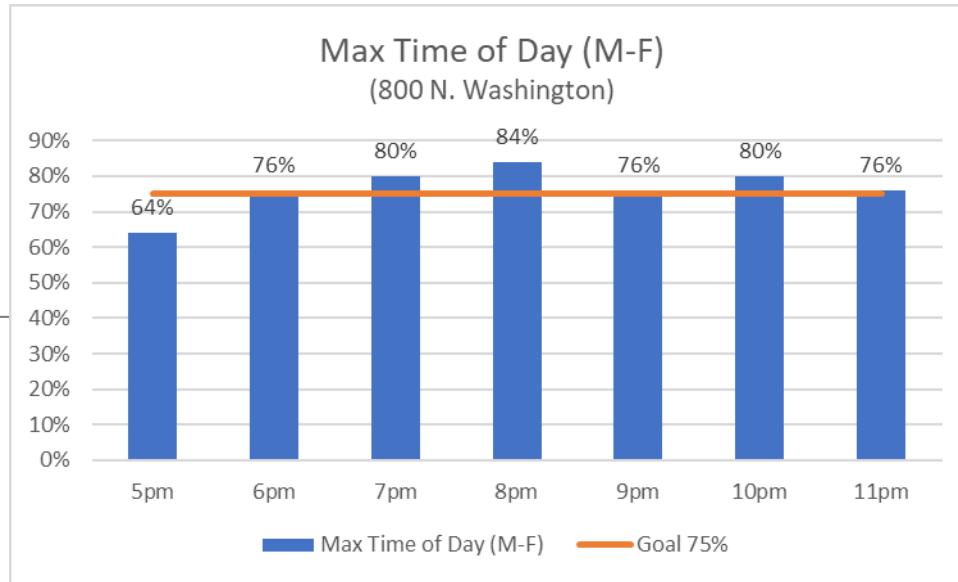


Residential Parking Program (Qualifying Blocks)

Parking Study Data



PARC shall use the results of parking study to develop a parking management plan and submit to Louisville Forward

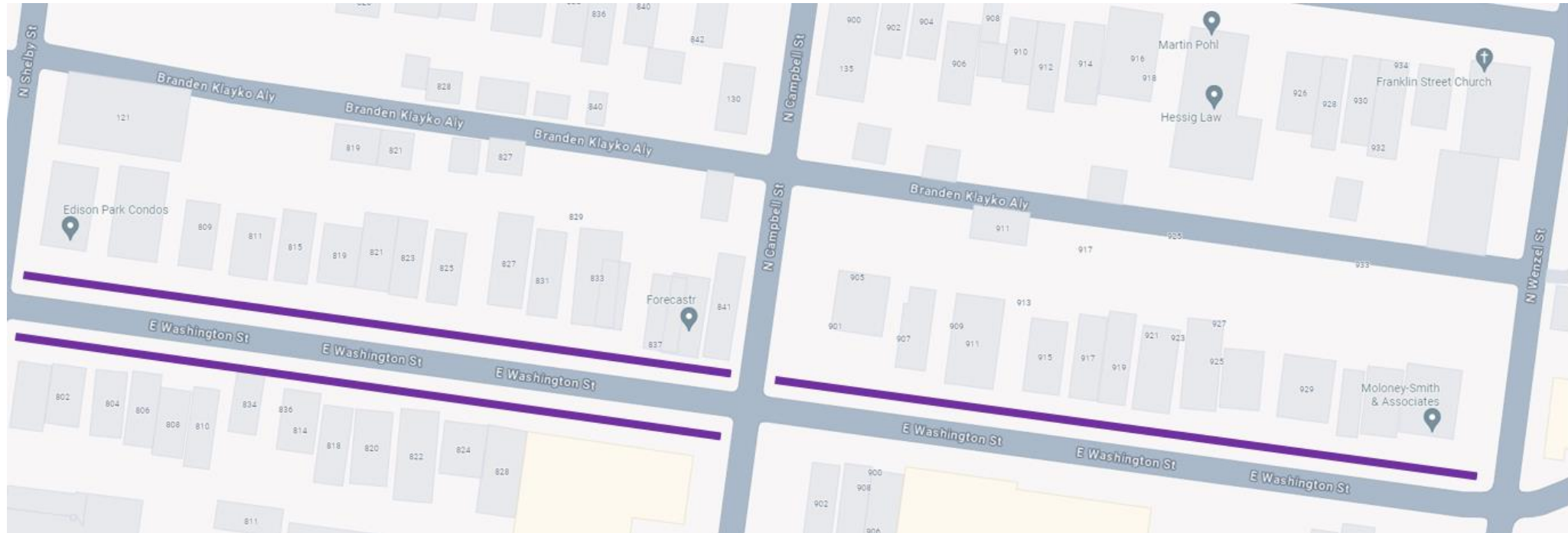
Louisville Forward shall review, economic impact of the plan on nonresidential uses in the area, specifically although not exclusively, the adequacy of available off-street parking for these uses

If special districts, historic areas or other special designations exist within, or near the area proposed, Louisville Forward shall notify appropriate Metro Government agencies for comment

Parking Proposed Plan Boundaries/Enforcement

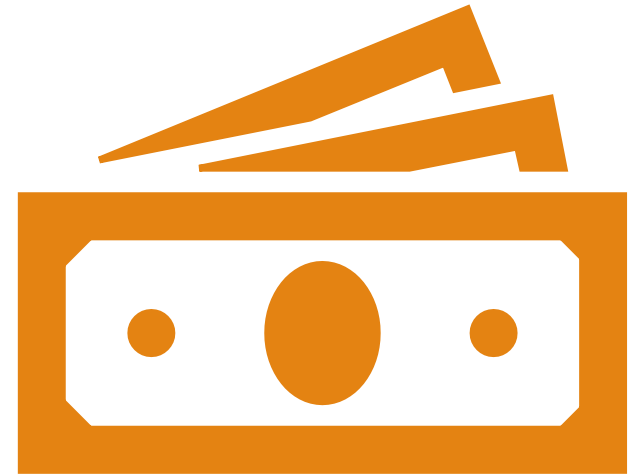

Permit Fees

Resident Permit	\$100 Annually
Visitor Permit	\$50 Annually
Event Permit	\$20 Per Event Period
Replacement	\$20
Temporary Permit	No Charge



Permit Eligibility

1. Each person with a primary residence within the RPZ, limited to one parking permit per resident having any motor vehicle owned by, and registered to, or principally used by the RPZ resident;
2. A vehicle regularly utilized by a person who is employed by a person or entity that owns or leases residential property within the RPZ;
3. Any vehicle utilized in the area by an institution, such as a church, school, or hospital, located wholly or partially within the RPZ.



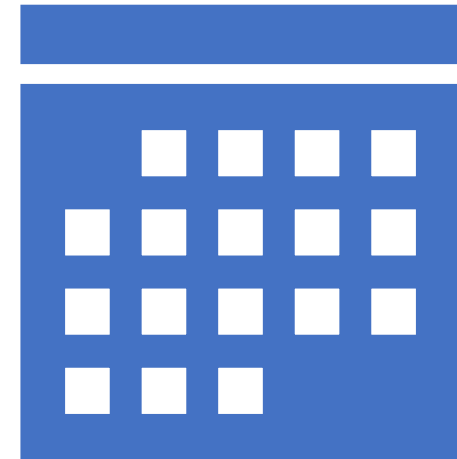
Visitor Permits

1. Upon application of any resident of an RPZ, PARC shall issue a visitor parking permit to the resident for temporary use on a visitor's vehicle.
2. No more than two visitor parking permits shall be issued to any one dwelling unit, at any one time. For the purposes of this regulation, the resident shall be the holder of the visitor permit and shall be responsible for its use or misuse.
3. Visitor permits are transferable between automobiles. No resident of the RPZ may use the visitor permits for their personal vehicles.

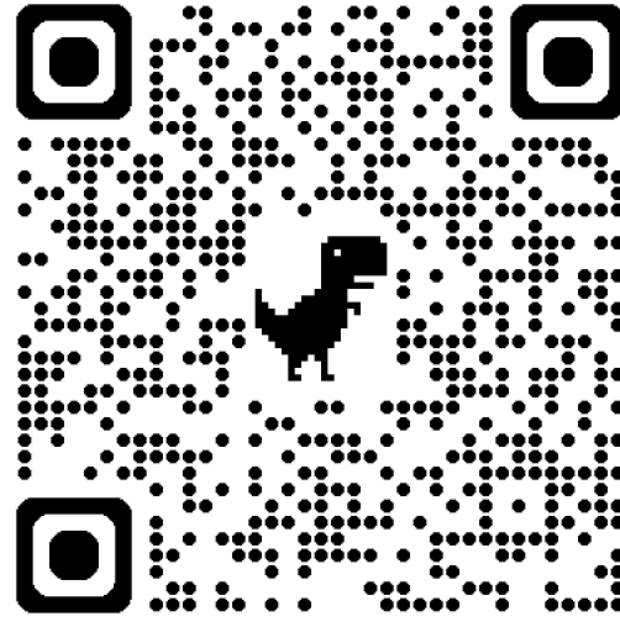


Special Permits

1. Event Permits - any person or persons attending special meetings/events may apply for event permit. PARC to determine the applicable restrictions, day/date/time/validity which shall be prominently indicated on permit. (No permit shall be valid for a period of longer than one year).
2. Temporary Permits - any person or persons requesting special exception for a one-day period only may request such permit from PARC. No fee is charged. (No more than 4 such permits in one year)
