Topic	Question	Answer
COVID-19	Since the California change in COVID-19 guidelines for returning to school, have other schools seen a significant increases in cases? The person who submitted this question has at their school.	Whenever there are multiple positive cases of something, such a chicken pox, COVID-19, etc., it is best to call/contact the County Health Department to report those cases – they will advise what to do from there. Do not wait for the definition of an outbreak to be reached before discussing with the County office.
Hazardous Materials	Do you have any suggestions for disposal of expired medications left at schools?	It depends on whether the medication is considered medical waste or hazardous waste per federal regulations. Certain medications are categorized as hazardous waste, and other medications are categorized as medical waste and should be picked up by a medical waste hauler. Check out this County resource guide on how to identify and dispose of pharmaceutical waste.
Revive & Survive	Is there funding to purchase training, equipment, and materials to support this work in schools? If so, who can schools contact?	You can contact revivesurvivesandiego@gmail.com with any questions and for information on how to support this work in schools.
Revive & Survive	Some high schools have Red Cross clubs. Can they contribute?	Yes, please have them email revivesurvivesandiego@gmail.com and we can discuss ways we can work with them to provide trainings for the community.
Revive & Survive	Is this free or is there a fee for school districts?	It depends on the group that is being trained. Trainings are free, but you would need to check with your school district on the specific requirements. You can also visit our website at revivesurvive.ucsd.edu for more information.
Revive & Survive	How long is the training?	CPR training classes take 30-40 minutes to complete. Some teachers have also been providing these trainings during PE classes.

Revive & Survive	Just to confirm, are the trainings for hands-only CPR classes free for students/staff?	For the most part, yes. Some of our training partners require a cost to take their trainings, and AHA has a few paid curriculums for schools. Tuberculosis	Will the increase in tuberculosis cases in San Diego County affect the tuberculosis screenings done in schools for volunteers and staff?	We have not heard or been told anything different at this time.
What I Wish My Parents Knew	Is there an age group that you focus on?	We often work with middle school and high school student populations, however our focus can be tailored to other age groups as needed.
What I Wish My Parents Knew	Are "What I Wish My Parents Knew" events conducted in Spanish as well?	They can be – we have worked with schools in San Diego Unified School District that have utilized their own translation services, but we can most certainly support with translation services on our end as well.
