Communicable Disease Guidance	Is there a printout of guidelines school health personnel should be using to determine when students with fevers or other symptoms of infection should be required to stay home from school?	When students are ill, school personnel should follow guidance from the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) to support informed and proactive decision-making.
