Why is Recycling Important in Baltimore?

- Recycling turns materials that would otherwise become waste into valuable resources.
- It helps sustain our environment and conserves energy.
- Recycling prevents pollution through the decrease of greenhouse gas emissions and preserves natural resources.
- It protects and increases the number of manufacturing jobs while generating revenue for Baltimore City.

Recycling is as easy as 1, 2, 3.

1. Use any container you want: paper bags, cardboard boxes, or old laundry basket. You can even use trash cans (just mark it "recycling"). The only rule? Do not place recycling in plastic bags.
2. Fill your container with recyclables: paper, cans, cardboard, and bottles.
3. Put out all the recyclables you can. There are no limits.
