3. You have the right to have a lawyer.

 - (A) explaining the charges in this paper;
 - (B) telling you the possible penalties;
 - (C) helping you at trial;
 - (D) helping you protect your constitutional rights; and
 - (E) helping you get a fair penalty if convicted.
5. Even if you plan to plead guilty, a lawyer can be helpful.
6. If you want a lawyer but do not have the money to hire one, the Public Defender may provide a lawyer for you. The court clerk will tell you how to contact the Public Defender.
7. If you want a lawyer but you cannot get one and the Public Defender will not provide one for you, contact the court clerk as soon as possible.
8. **DO NOT WAIT UNTIL THE DATE OF YOUR TRIAL TO GET A LAWYER.** If you do not have a lawyer before the trial date, you may have to go to trial without one.

INDICTMENT

The Jurors of the State of Maryland for the body of the City of Baltimore, do on their oath present that the aforesaid DEFENDANT(S), late of said City, heretofore on or about **October 27, 2023**, at **2200 Block of Presstman Street**, unlawfully did assault [REDACTED] in the first degree in violation of Criminal Law Article, Section 3-202 of the Annotated Code of Maryland; against the peace, government and dignity of the State.

FACTS

1. On October 27, 2023, at shortly before 8:00 a.m., WILLIAM DREDDEN, his son, [REDACTED], age 15, and [REDACTED] mother, Tiffany HARRISON (“co-conspirators”) worked in concert to commit a first degree assault on [REDACTED] by striking him repeatedly with a handgun and their fists as he waited for his classes to begin at Carver High School. As WILLIAM DREDDEN, [REDACTED] and Tiffany HARRISON started to leave the area after attacking [REDACTED], [REDACTED] fired his handgun at [REDACTED], striking [REDACTED] with at least two gunshots and also striking [REDACTED], who was standing with [REDACTED] when [REDACTED] began firing. [REDACTED], who was struck by bullet(s) fired by [REDACTED] was driven away from the scene by WILLIAM DREDDEN and Tiffany HARRISON. All events were captured on video.
2. Shortly before 8:00 a.m. on October 27, 2023, private surveillance video from the 1800 block of Braddish Avenue showed WILLIAM DREDDEN, an adult male wearing a red

hoodie, khaki pants, and red tennis shoes gets into the driver's seat of a silver 2020 Ford Edge SUV parked in the 1800 block of Braddish Avenue; Tiffany HARRISON, an adult female, wearing light blue pants, a black and white plaid shirt, and a long black hair bonnet, and whose home is located in the block, enters the front passenger seat, after which the vehicle pulls away, making a right turn onto Westwood Avenue.

3. At approximately 7:45 a.m., a group of approximately ten young people, including [REDACTED] and [REDACTED], were standing on the sidewalk outside of Carver High School, at the corner of Presstman and Bentalou Streets, waiting for the day's classes to begin.
4. At approximately 7:48 a.m., a young male, wearing black pants, a black hoodie with red letters on the front and a white graphic with a red lettering on the back and a black fitted balaclava covering his head and chin, later identified as [REDACTED] walks into camera view on Presstman Street from the eastern side of Carver High School toward the corner at Bentalou Street; his mother, Tiffany HARRISON, wearing light blue pants, a black and white plaid shirt and a long black hair bonnet, follows a few paces behind and WILLIAM DREDDEN, wearing a red hoodie with white lettering on the left sleeve with the hood up, khaki pants, and red tennis shoes, initially walks several paces behind HARRISON, then jogs to catch up to [REDACTED] and Tiffany HARRISON as they approached the group at the corner.
5. [REDACTED] walks directly to [REDACTED] who is standing with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED], and appears to speak to him and/or the group; Tiffany HARRISON continues to approach and stands next to her son. [REDACTED] begins hitting [REDACTED] and WILLIAM DREDDEN runs the last several feet toward the group and pushes [REDACTED] to the ground; Tiffany HARRISON continues to stand next to her son [REDACTED] as he strikes [REDACTED] with a handgun held in his right hand. A low wall obscures the lower portions of [REDACTED] and the DREDDEN-HARRISON family. [REDACTED] hits [REDACTED] several times with the handgun and WILLIAM DREDDEN strikes [REDACTED] multiple times with his right fist; Tiffany HARRISON stands by as [REDACTED] and WILLIAM DREDDEN continue to beat [REDACTED], leaning in, raising and lowering her right arm and hand, seeming to strike [REDACTED], who is out of view on the ground behind the wall.

6. Finally, Tiffany HARRISON starts to walk away, then takes a couple of steps back toward the altercation; [REDACTED] then starts to walk away with his mother, while WILLIAM DREDDEN delivers some final blows to [REDACTED]. Tiffany HARRISON, and WILLIAM DREDDEN all begin to walk back toward the direction from which they had arrived, with [REDACTED] in the lead.
7. At the start of the altercation [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] moved a few feet away and stood nearby, watching as [REDACTED] and WILLIAM DREDDEN and Tiffany HARRISON pistol whip and beat [REDACTED]
8. [REDACTED] encounters [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] after a few steps; [REDACTED], whose gun cannot be seen but whose right hand is in his right jacket pocket, looks at [REDACTED], [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] then simultaneously pull out handguns and shoot multiple times at each other. During the gunfire, [REDACTED] grabs his abdomen where it is later found he has been shot; [REDACTED] falls backwards down some steps, continuing to fire at [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] suffers gunshots to his chest and right leg; [REDACTED] suffers a gunshot wound to his flank area.
9. During the exchange of gunfire between [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] WILLIAM DREDDEN and Tiffany HARRISON take cover by the wall and a nearby parked vehicle. After the shooting ends, WILLIAM DREDDEN and Tiffany HARRISON follow [REDACTED] as he flees in the direction from which they had initially arrived.
10. Private surveillance video from the 1800 block of Braddish Avenue showed the same silver 2020 Ford Edge SUV pull into the 1800 block of Braddish Avenue shortly after the shooting was reported to police. WILLIAM DREDDEN, wearing the same red hoodie, khaki pants, and red tennis shoes, emerges from the driver's seat and opens the driver's side rear door; records indicate that he has called 911, reporting that his son has been shot. Tiffany HARRISON emerges from the front passenger seat, wearing the same light blue pants and a black and white plaid shirt; she crosses the street and enters her residence; she re-emerges a few minutes later, wearing different clothing. WILLIAM DREDDEN removes his red hoodie, which was later found in the vacant lot next to Tiffany HARRISON's residence.

Assault First Degree, Conspiracy, Accessory After the Fact, etc

11. Tiffany HARRISON accompanies [REDACTED] in the ambulance to Shock Trauma where [REDACTED] was treated for his injuries.

SECOND COUNT

The Jurors of the State of Maryland for the body of the City of Baltimore, do on their oath present the aforesaid DEFENDANT(S), late of said City, heretofore on or about **OCTOBER 27, 2023**, in and around the 2200 block of Presstman Street in Baltimore City, and in the State of Maryland, did **CONSPIRE** with **William Dredden and [REDACTED]**, and others known and unknown, to assault [REDACTED] in the first degree in violation of the Criminal Article, Section 3-202 of the Annotated Code of Maryland; against the peace, government and dignity of the State.


