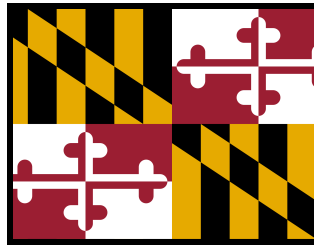

91% of students developed or improved a behavioral health skill.

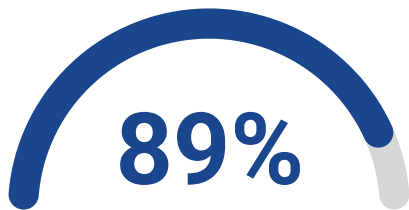
