About the Scholarship

The application deadline for fall 2019 is **April 15, 2019**. The scholarship covers the full cost of tuition, fees, and course-required resources. The Pillars of Strength Scholarship Program is managed by UMUC and The Blewitt Foundation in association with the National Military Family Association.

Eligibility Criteria

To be considered for this scholarship program, you must be a spouse, parent, stepparent, sibling, stepsibling, fiancé, child, stepchild, or friend of a servicemember or veteran who became wounded, injured, or ill in the line-of-duty after September 11, 2001. In addition, you must serve as a caregiver, either as a VA-designated caregiver or a DoD-designated non-medical attendant (NMA), to that servicemember or veteran.
