item 2 - Advertisement for Veterans who are interested in apply for a service dog

<u>Hero Dogs, Inc.</u> places service dogs with veterans and first-responders with disabilities. We also place skilled home companion dogs with veteran and first-responder families.

To qualify for a dog:

- You must be a veteran of the U.S. Uniformed Services with an honorable or general (under honorable conditions) discharge. Discharges other than honorable will be considered on a case by case basis. First responders must have an equivalent, verifiable service record.
- You must be released from all military and reserve obligations.
- You must have a disability as <u>defined by the ADA</u>, i.e. a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities, a history or record of such an impairment, or be perceived by others as having such an impairment. Note that your disability does not need to be service connected and we do not require any minimum VA disability rating.
- You must live within 50 miles or approximately one hour's travel time of Hero Dogs (Brookeville, MD), and be able to provide your own transportation.
- If your disability includes PTSD or any other psychiatric disability, you must currently be in counseling, and must remain in mental health treatment for the duration of your matching and training with Hero Dogs.

If you meet these basic criteria, please visit our <u>Applicants page</u> to see the rest of the requirements and request an application. If you do NOT meet these eligibility criteria, please visit <u>Assistance Dogs International, Inc.</u> (ADI) to locate a service dog agency that places dogs in your area or nationally. ADI is a coalition of not-for-profit organizations that train and place service, guide, and hearing dogs.
