Maine Universal Immunization Program

Expanded to Include Adults

LAUNCHING JULY 2026

Expanding Access. Reducing Barriers. Supporting Providers.

Starting in July 2026, Maine’s Universal Immunization Program will expand access to recommended vaccines for adults ages 19 - 64, including those who are underinsured, uninsured, privately insured, or enrolled in MaineCare, helping providers to deliver these vaccines at no cost. 65+ will not be covered by state



supplied vaccine unless the patient is under- or uninsured. Patients 65+ who are covered by Medicare will continue to receive privately supplied vaccine. Those on Medicare who are disabled and 19 - 64 will be eligible to receive state supplied vaccine as an "underinsured" individual.

What Is the Universal Immunization Program?

The Universal Childhood Vaccine Program, launched in 2012, provides vaccines to children from 0 through 18 years. In June 2025, legislation was passed, that expanded access to adults ages 19 - 64.

Vaccines will be available through participating healthcare providers using a single, streamlined system. Enrolled providers will be able to order all recommended vaccines through the Maine Immunization Program, regardless of their patient population.
