



# COVID-19 SYMPTOMS

- Fever • Cough • Muscle Pain
- Shortness of Breath
- Chills • Sore Throat
- New Loss of Taste or Smell
- Headache
- Repeated Shaking with Chills

Symptoms may appear 2-14 days after exposure. Older adults and persons with serious chronic medical conditions like heart disease, diabetes, lung disease, and people with weakened immune systems are at higher risk of becoming seriously ill from COVID-19. Persons in these categories should pay close attention to the symptoms highlighted above.

If you feel you are developing symptoms, or have other symptoms that are severe or concerning, contact your medical provider.

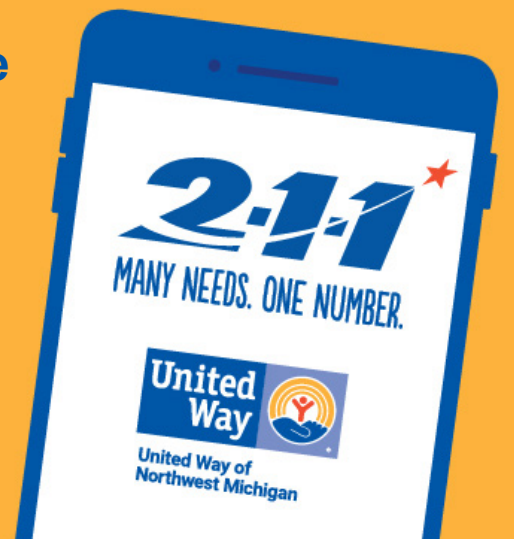

## COVID-19 PREVENTION TIPS

## HOMEOWNERS PROPERTY TAX ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Wayne County Property Tax Foreclosures  
suspended for 2020 but, **you still must  
pay property taxes as normal.** Use this  
time to apply for any available tax breaks  
and get on the right payment plan.

**2020 Poverty Tax Exemption (HPTAP)**  
Deadline extended to December 14th

HPTAP approved homeowners with  
delinquent taxes can enroll in Pay As  
You Stay (PAYS) Reduced Payment  
Plan Reduced Payment Plan.
