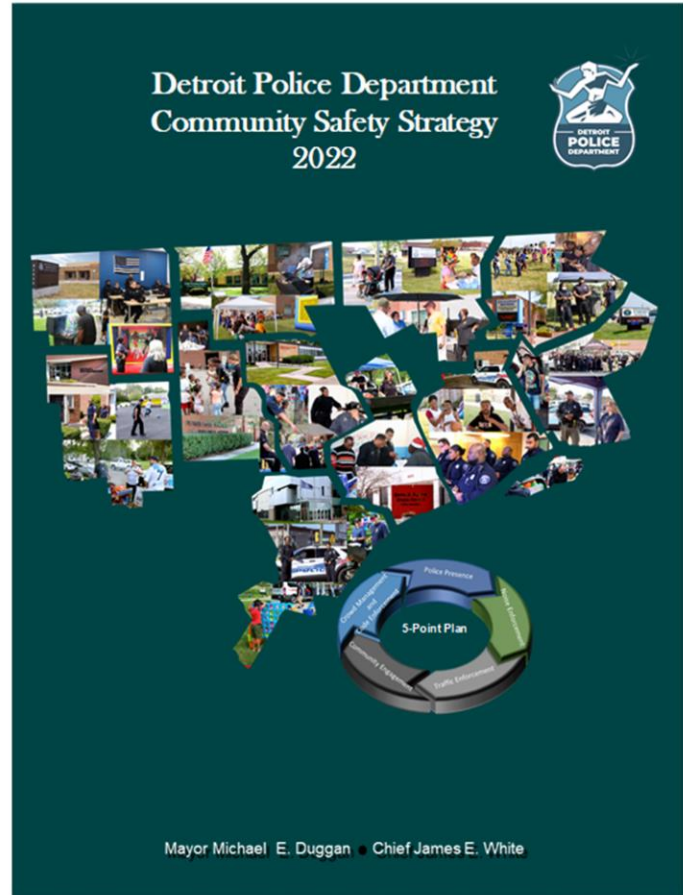

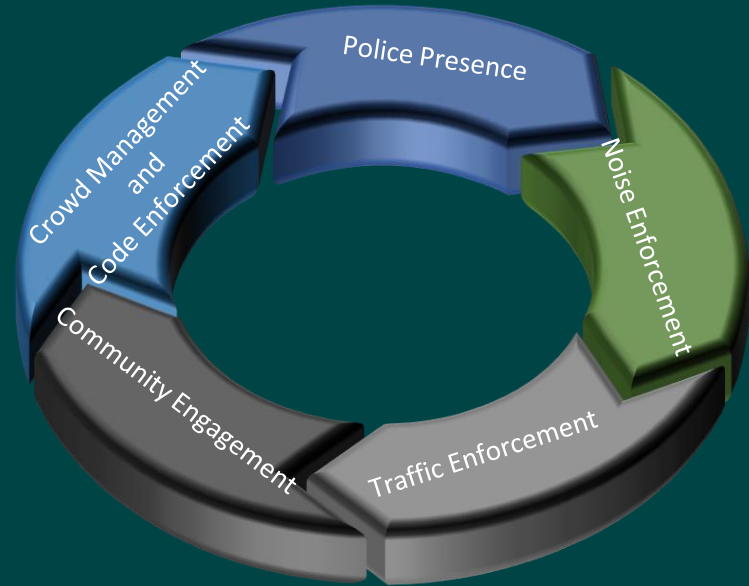

Key metrics as of June 1, 2021:

Crowd Management and Code Enforcement:

Identifying specific domains that are problematic within specific unit/precinct area

Utilizing Resources and Technology – Identifying useful technology and resources along with anticipated use of specialize services

Police Presence:

Increase Police presence in the communalities. In addition, Mayor Mike Duggan has approved 4,000 hours of overtime pay to patrol areas like Greektown and the Riverfront, along with other destinations that draw big gatherings.

Noise Enforcement:

Business and vehicles ticketed for playing music after 10pm.

Strictly enforce the city's noise ordinance that makes it "unlawful to maintain or operate an outdoor speaker that is affixed to any structure or placed upon any property where the speaker is audible for a distance of more that fifty (50) feet from the source.

Traffic Enforcement:

Officers were allotted 2,000 overtime hours to patrol drag racing and drifting. The city's Real Time Crime Center has about 150 staff monitoring social media for illegal street races and motorists who do burnouts in intersections.

Community Engagement:

Continue to build relationships in the communities and with key stakeholders. If you know people contributing to the any problems, tell a nearby police officer. More importantly, we want individuals to resolve their conflicts peacefully.

Impact of the 5-Point Plan

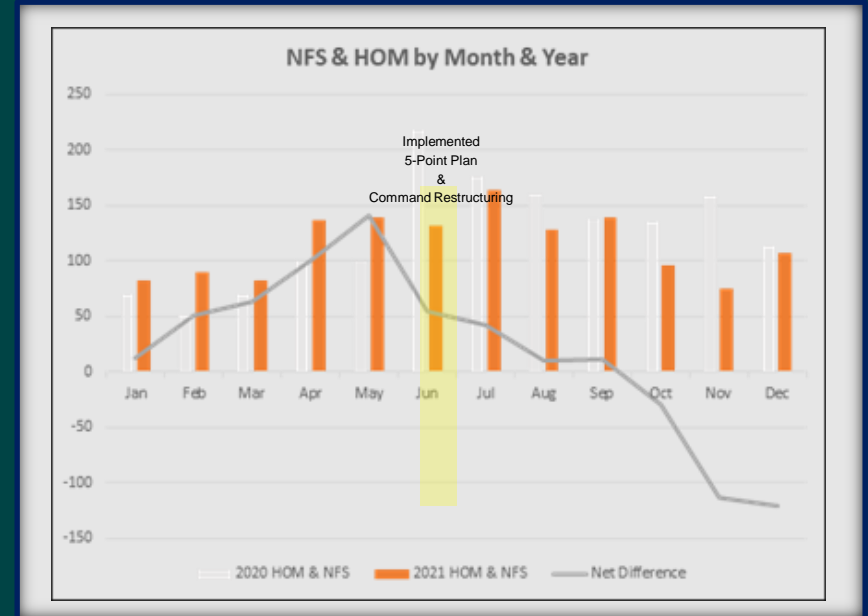
End 2021 Year:

- 4% reduction in Homicides
- 9% reduction in non-fatal shootings

And the trends continue in the right direction:

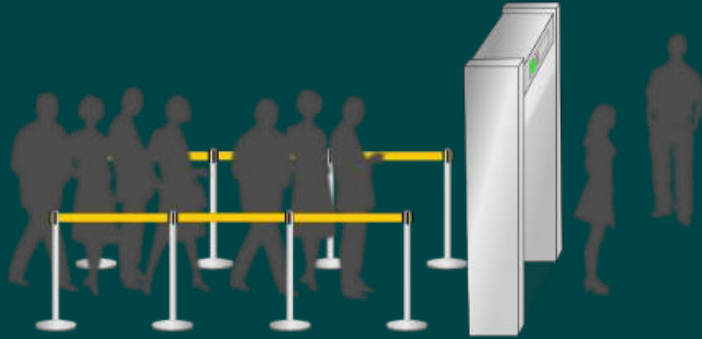
2022 YTD (as of 3/18/22):

- 18% decrease in Homicides
- 21% reduction in non-fatal shootings

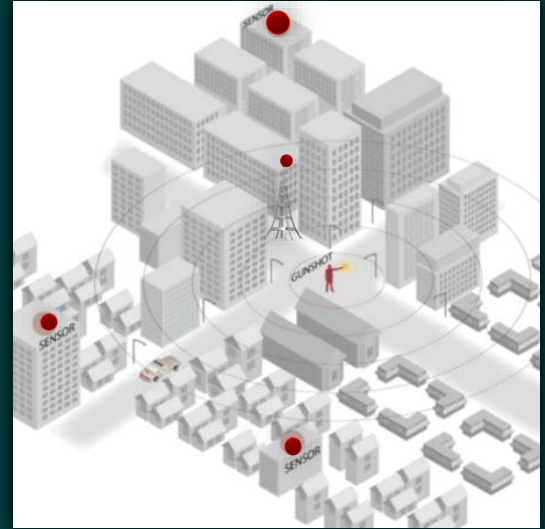

- Business and vehicles ticketed for playing loud music after 10 p.m. in violation of City of Detroit ordinances.



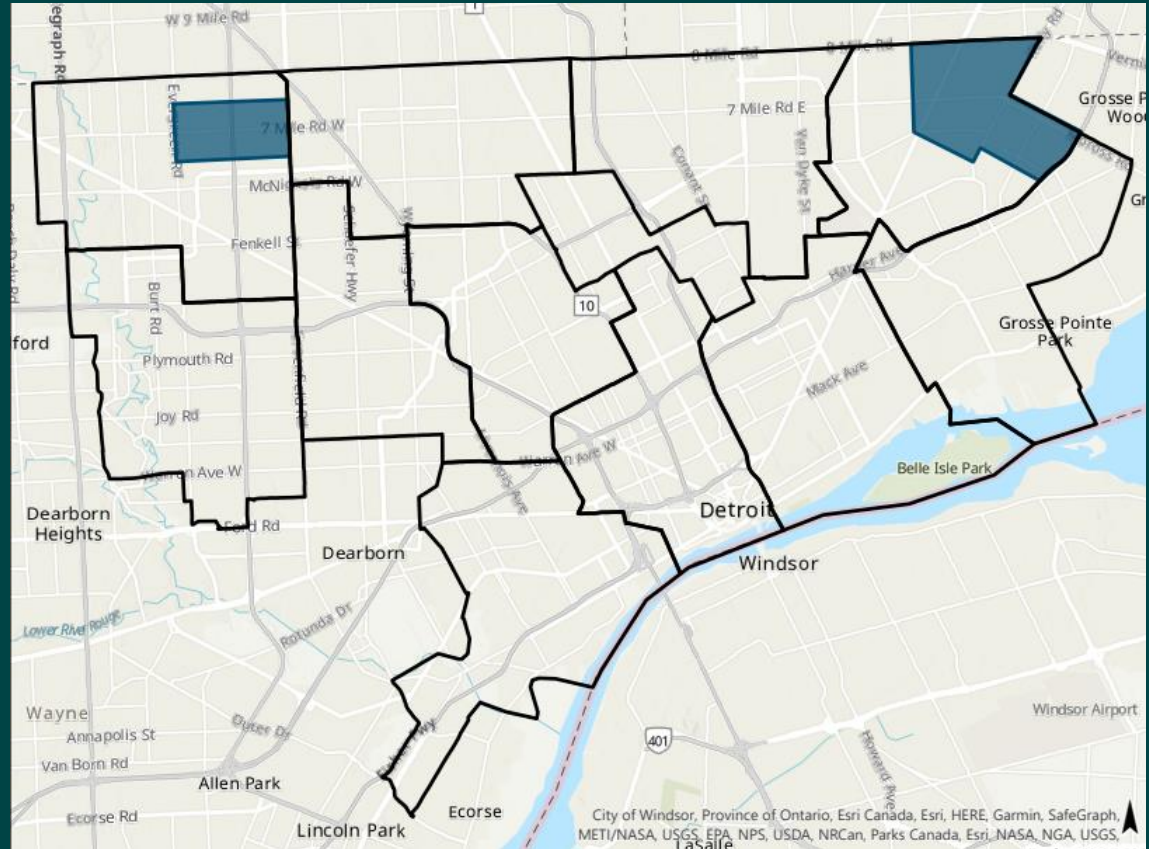
Shot Spotter

Is a gun shot detection sensors. It can tell you if it is in the front yard, or backyard if someone is firing from a vehicle, which direction they were firing. It can also detect gunshots, even down to the caliber used. The receiver - sends an alert like the example shown in the picture.

Shot Spotter: Current Deployment

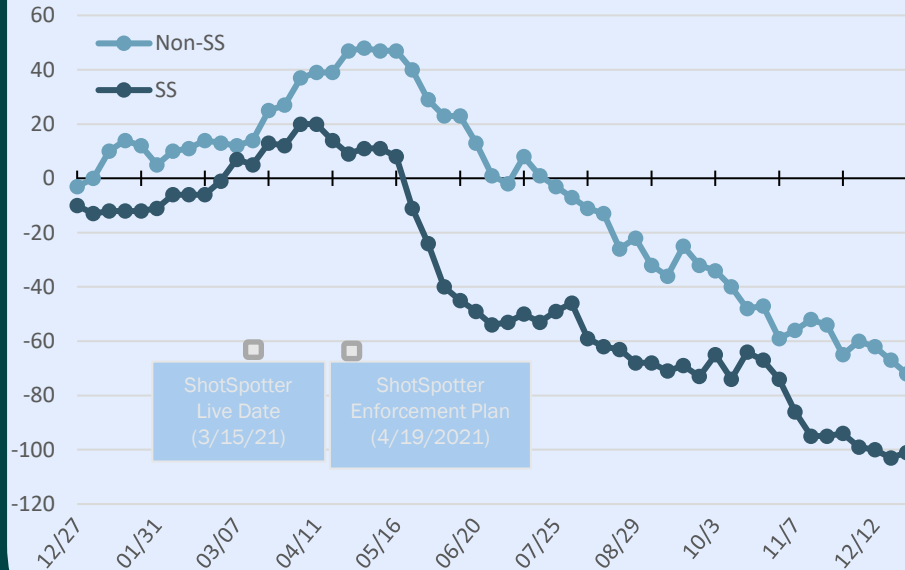

Shot Spotter: Proof of Concept

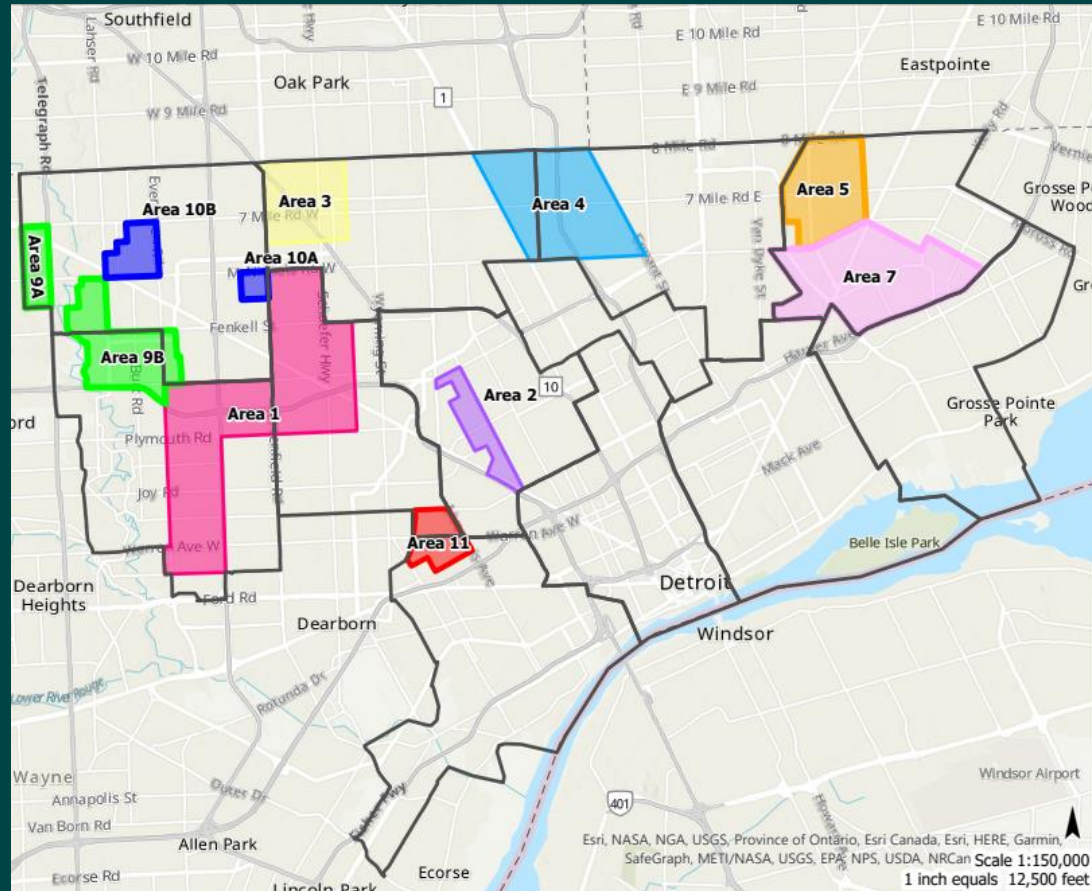
Comparing Cumulative Difference in 9th Precinct

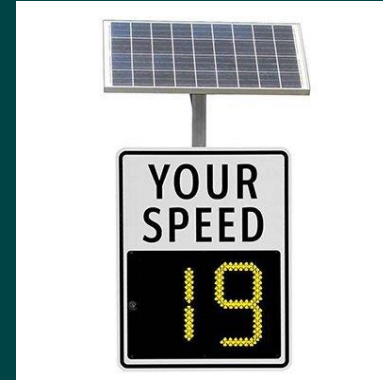
