Dear Licensee,

You are receiving this email because you either hold a Michigan Expedited Medical Compact license (issued through the Interstate Medical Licensure Compact Commission) or your state of principal license is Michigan for the purpose of licensure through the Interstate Medical License Compact (IMLC).

This message is to inform you that pursuant to Michigan Public Act 38 of 2022, on March 29, 2025, Michigan began the process of withdrawing as a member of the IMLC. **Unless there is legislative action to reinstate participation in the compact, Michigan will no longer have the legal authority to be a member in the IMLC after March 28, 2026.**

As a result, we have prepared the following information for Michigan Expedited Medical Compact licensees and licensees with Michigan as your state of principal license.

Michigan Expedited Medical Compact Licensees

- Absent further action by the legislature to reinstate Michigan's participation in the IMLC, you will not be able to renew your Michigan Expedited Medical Compact after March 28, 2026.
- If you currently hold a Michigan Expedited Medical Compact license you will be able to continue to practice under that license through March 28, 2026. After March 28, 2026, any Michigan Expedited Medical Compact licenses will no longer be valid. Any related Michigan Controlled Substance license will also no longer be valid after March 28, 2026.
- If you currently hold a Michigan Expedited Medical Compact license and wish to continue to practice in Michigan after your Compact license is no longer valid, you may apply for a MD or DO license in the state of Michigan by visiting [our website](#).

Individuals with Michigan as your State of Principal License

- If Michigan is your state of principal license, you must maintain a state of principal license through the compact under [Compact Rule 4](#). You will not be able to renew your license in any state through the compact if you have not redesignated your state of principal license prior to Michigan's exit from the Compact on March 28, 2026.
- To redesignate your state of principal licensure you can go to the [IMLC website](#) and click on "REDESIGNATE". The IMLC has prepared an educational video that walks through the redesignation process. It is recommended that you watch [this instructional video](#) prior to beginning the process.

In the event the Michigan Legislature takes action that changes Michigan's status in the IMLC, we will send you a communication.
