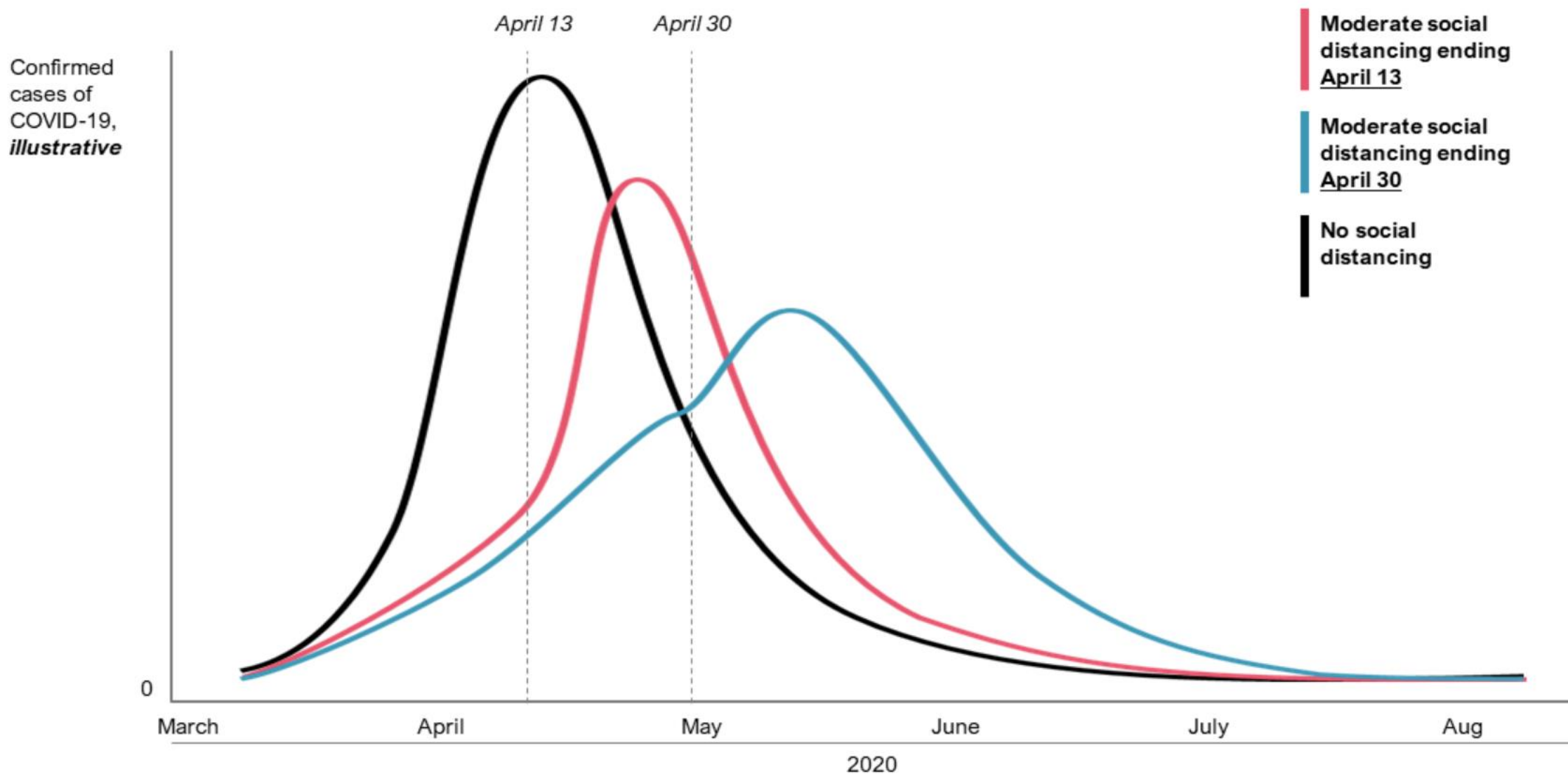

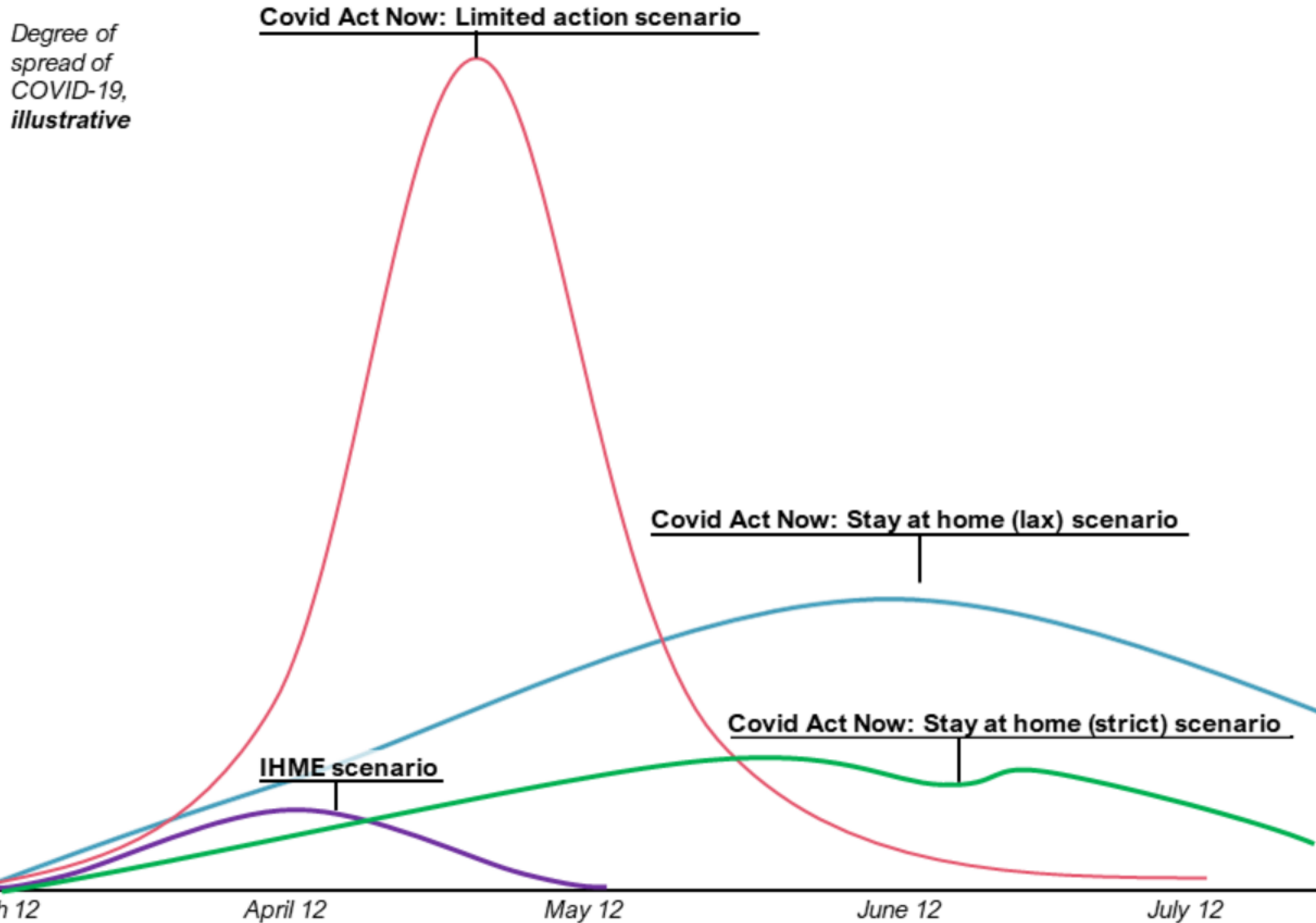
Implications of social distancing time range on COVID-19 cases

Range of COVID-19 scenarios for Michigan from national models



The State of Michigan is evaluating multiple models and actively monitoring the rate of spread of COVID-19 and adherence to Stay Home, Stay Safe measures to determine the shape and size of Michigan's curve.

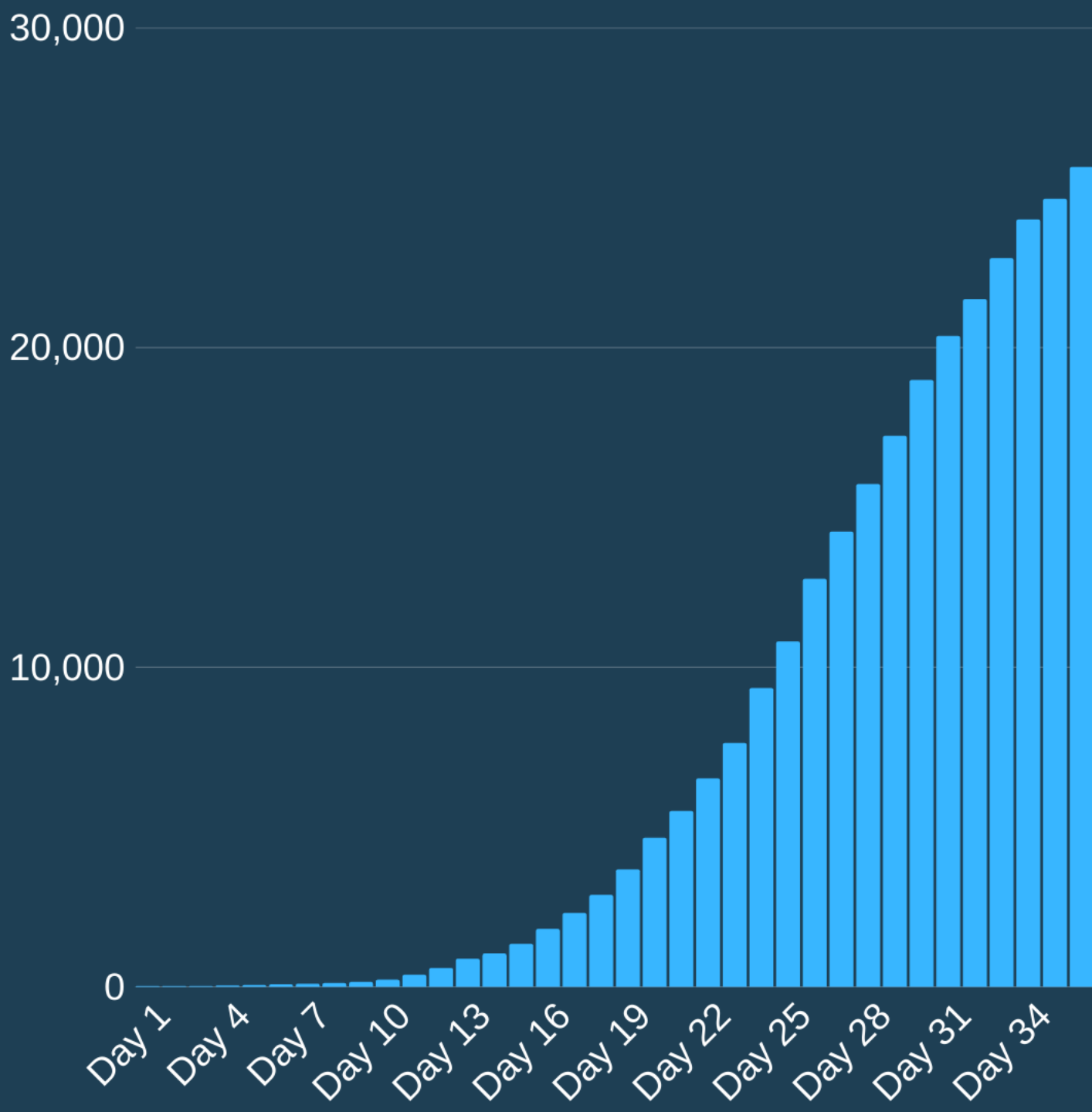
These four scenarios represent only a few of the many models being evaluated, which show scenarios both within and beyond the range shown here. These include the University of Michigan's School of Public Health model, which allows for a range of social distancing scenarios.

SINCE THURSDAY:

- Today I joined a coalition of 12 governors who called on the Trump administration to allow for a special enrollment period of at least 30 days on the federal health care exchange.
- We worked with nearly all of the state's health insurance companies to waive cost-sharing, including copays, deductibles, and coinsurance for COVID-19 testing and treatments.
- We announced 13 new or expanded COVID-19 drive-thru testing sites in Detroit Flint, and throughout Michigan that will provide greater access to residents across Michigan and a new lab will speed up test results.
- We've confirmed with DTE that they will deliver about 2 million N95 masks to Michigan, on top of the 300,000 they have already delivered.

Today, the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services launched a statewide hotline for Michiganders whose mental health has been impacted by the COVID-19 crisis.

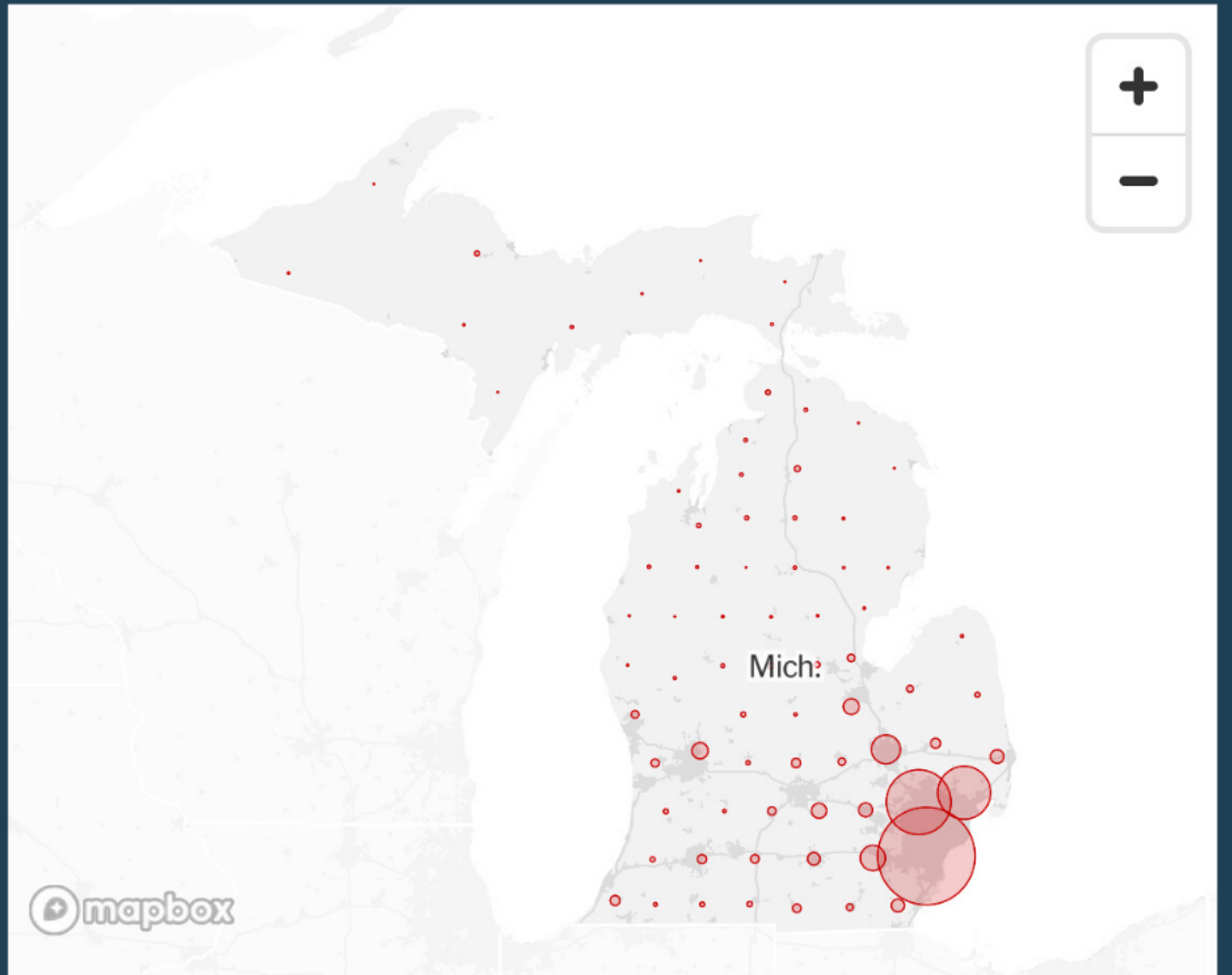
