Last November, Michiganders voted overwhelmingly to pass Proposal 2, making it easier to vote in a secure way by offering nine days of early, in-person voting, ensuring overseas service members get their votes counted, and guaranteeing that absentee ballots are free to mail in. Nationally, we continue to see threats against the integrity of elections.

As we look back on the 2020 election, we can all see how close we came to a genuine constitutional crisis. There was a concerted, coordinated effort not only to overturn the result of the election, but also to intimidate voters prior to the election and threaten election workers during the counting process.

what's next

Michiganders voted to expand voting rights, and now we must shore up election security. We cannot allow the will of the people to be ignored or overturned, nor can we risk politicians staying in office despite getting voted out.
