

INCREASING WATER INFRASTRUCTURE INVESTMENT BY AN AFFORDABLE \$5 PER PERSON, PER YEAR WILL GENERATE \$110 MILLION

## **ANNUAL AMOUNT**

#### 1. INTEGRATED ASSET MANAGEMENT

\$25 million

- Drinking water, wastewater, and stormwater plans
- **Ongoing data collection and training**
- Integrate water and sewer plans with other infrastructure

#### 2. CAPITAL GRANT/LOAN PROGRAM

\$75 million

- **Lead service line replacements**
- Water, sewer, stormwater capital projects

#### 3. EMERGENCY INFRASTRUCTURE FAILURE FUND

\$10 million

Grant and loan programs for communities in financial need with emergency water or sewer failures

**TOTAL: \$110 MILLION** 

- AN AFFORDABLE \$5/PERSON/YEAR WOULD ADD ABOUT 2% TO AN ANNUAL WATER BILL
- THE PROPOSAL WILL PHASE IN OVER THE NEXT 5 YEARS

Phase in amounts are \$1/year each year for 5 years:

**■** 2020 – \$1/person **■** 2021 – \$2/person **■** 2022 – \$3/person **■** 2023 – \$4/person **■** 2024 – \$5/person

- 80% OF MONEY GENERATED WOULD BE RETURNED TO THE REGION IT WAS GENERATED IN
- THE PROPOSAL WOULD EXPIRE IN 2040
