Dear Mr. Gensch & Mr. Watson:

Consumers Energy Company and DTE Gas Company shall mail, by April 16, 2024, a copy of the enclosed notice of hearing to each landowner from whom it has not acquired the property rights for the proposed pipeline, all cities, incorporated villages, townships and counties which may be traversed by the proposed pipeline, and all federally recognized Tribes of Michigan with a land claim or reserved treaty rights within the route of the proposed pipeline. Proof of service shall be filed by the prehearing conference on April 30, 2024.

Consumers Energy Company and DTE Gas Company shall cause the enclosed notice of hearing to be published, by April 16, 2024, in newspapers of general circulation in Charter Township of Orion, Oakland County, Michigan, and in the Michigan Oil and Gas News. Publishing requirements and a copy of the publishing format are enclosed. Affidavits of publication shall be filed by the prehearing conference on April 30, 2024.

Consumers Energy Company shall and DTE Gas Company, by April 30, 2024, serve upon each person who has petitioned to intervene a copy of the written direct testimony of its proposed witnesses and the proposed exhibits as filed with the Commission. Proofs of service shall be filed with the Commission by May 7, 2024.

The Michigan Public Service Commission (Commission) will hold a pre-hearing to consider Consumers Energy Company (Consumers Energy) and DTE Gas Company's (DTE Gas) January 26, 2024 application requesting the Commission to: 1) approve Consumers Energy to construct and operate an approximately 130-foot length pipeline to connect the Oakland Resilience Interconnect (ORI) to Consumers Energy's 36-inch Line 2700 and approve DTE Gas to construct and operate an approximately 200-foot length pipeline to connect the ORI to DTE Gas's 36-inch E Line, located within Charter Township of Orion, Oakland County, Michigan; 2) determine that the proposed Oakland Resilience Interconnect pipelines, when constructed and in operation, will serve the convenience and necessities of the public; 3) authorize Consumers Energy and DTE Gas to construct and operate the pipelines; 3) approve the route of the proposed pipelines, subject to such minor changes in location as may become necessary upon actual construction; 5) approve the specifications for the proposed Oakland Resilience Interconnect pipelines; and 6) grant DTE Gas and Consumers Energy such other and further relief as is just and reasonable.

All documents filed in this case shall be submitted electronically through the Commission's E-Dockets website at: michigan.gov/mpscedockets. Requirements and instructions for filing can be found in the User Manual on the E-Dockets help page. Documents may also be submitted, in Word or PDF format, as an attachment to an email sent to: mpscedockets@michigan.gov. R 792.10422 Adjournments.

Rule 422

- (1) Unless the presiding officer allows otherwise, a request for adjournment shall be by motion or stipulation made orally at a hearing or in writing and shall be based on good cause.
- (2) A motion or stipulation for adjournment shall state the party who is requesting the adjournment and the reason for the adjournment.
 - (3) An adjournment may be granted for good cause and shall be in writing or on the record.
- (4) In granting an adjournment, the presiding officer, administrative law manager assigned by the hearing system to the commission, or commission may impose reasonable conditions.

R 792.10432 Motion practice.

Rule 432

- (1) In a pending proceeding, a request to the commission or presiding officer for a ruling or order, other than a final order, shall be by motion. Unless made during a hearing, a motion shall be in compliance with all of the following provisions:
 - (a) Be in writing.
 - (b) State with particularity the grounds and authority on which the motion is based. (c) State the relief or order sought.
 - (d) Be signed by the party or the party's attorney.
- (2) Unless a different time is set by the commission or presiding officer or unless the motion is one that may be heard ex parte, a written motion, notice of the hearing on the motion, and any supporting brief or affidavits shall be served as follows:
 - (a) Not less than 9 days before the hearing, if served electronically or by mail.
- (b) Not less than 7 days before the hearing, if served electronically or by delivery to the attorney or party under Michigan court rule 2.107(c)(1) or (2).
- (3) Unless a different time is set by the commission or presiding officer, any response to a motion, including a brief or an affidavit, shall be served as follows:
 - (a) Not less than 5 days before the hearing, if served electronically or by mail.
- (b) Not less than 3 days before the hearing, if served electronically or by delivery to the attorney or party under Michigan court rule 2.107(c)(1) or (2).
- (4) Motions shall be noticed for hearing at the time designated by the commission or presiding officer.
- (5) When a motion is based on facts not appearing on the record, the commission or presiding officer may hear the motion on affidavits presented by the parties or may direct that the motion be heard wholly or partly as oral testimony or deposition.
- (6) The commission or presiding officer may limit oral arguments on motions and may require the parties to file briefs in support of, and in opposition to, a motion. The commission may dispense with oral argument on matters brought before the commission.
