Students work on preemployment skills in a residential facility. Students participate in vocational exploration and potential work experiences while at the Training Center.

<u>Description:</u> Students who are blind or visually impaired have an opportunity for a college experience prior to becoming full-time students. The program is designed to provide BSBP customers with training and skills needed to become successful full-time college students. Students will take in-person academic classes from WMU, and BSBP staff will provide Pre-ETS instruction toward college readiness. Students get the opportunity to enjoy campus life, a work experience and will earn a summer income.

Leader Dog Summer Camp

<u>Location</u>: Rochester Hills, MI <u>Dates</u>: June 25 - July 1, 2023

<u>Description</u>: This free program combines fun activities with exploring mobility options like guide dog travel, discovering leadership skills and building friendships with peers facing similar challenges. Campers receive a free HumanWare GPS to help increase their travel independence. They also have the opportunity to learn about living and working with a guide dog.

Teen Summer Camp is provided free of charge at Leader Dogs for the Blind's Rochester Hills, Michigan campus to those who are legally blind, 16 or 17 years of age, regardless of whether they plan to train with a guide

dog. Public transportation to and from a client's home to the Leader Dog campus and accommodations and meals while training is also provided free of charge.

Work Experiences

Business Enterprise Program (BEP) Summer Work Opportunity Program

Location: Various Michigan BEP locations

Dates: TBD- Summer/Ongoing

<u>Description</u>: This food service and vending internship in BSBP's Business Enterprise Program is for blind and visually impaired high school and college students ages 15 to 21. Students are paid minimum wage and typically work 20-30 hours each week, for up to 10 weeks. The program will provide participants with an opportunity to experience working under supervision, learn work requirements, develop work skills and determine if the BEP is a viable vocational option for him/her.

<u>Target Population:</u> High school and college students ages 15 to 21 BSBP Contact: Local BSBP Rehabilitation Professional

Referral Process: BEP will identify Operators who are willing to provide a work experience and Rehabilitation Professional will connect interested students to available opportunities. Interested students submit a resume to his/her Rehabilitation Professional. The Rehabilitation Professional will provide resumes to the BEP Operator. BEP Operators are encouraged to require participants to complete a job application and sit for a job interview. The Rehabilitation Professional can provide sample interview questions if requested.
