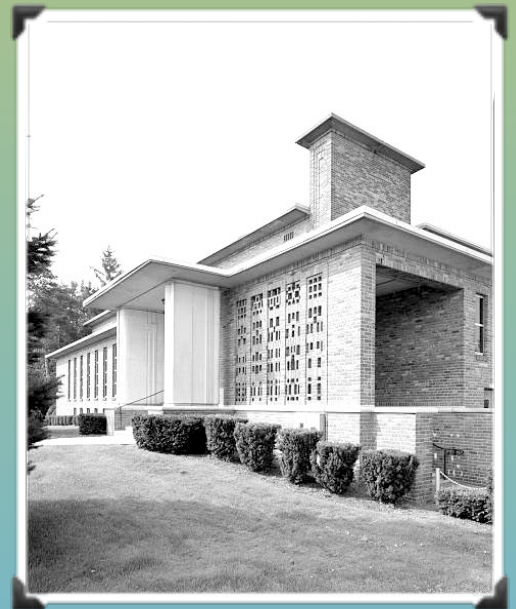

Designed by world-renown architects Eliel Saarinen and his son, Eero, the Community Center opened to great fanfare in the village of Fenton, the much-beloved hometown of Horace Rackham's widow, Mary A. (Horton) Rackham, in 1938. Funded by the Horace H. Rackham & Mary A. Rackham Fund, Mrs. F. W. (Horton) Whittlesey served as landscape architect for the three-acre site. A major addition to the National Register-listed property by Lindhout & Associates is in the completion stages.
