Plaster Repair Workshop

In this free, five-day workshop, participants will learn about the composition of historic plaster and the fundamentals of plaster repair and restoration, including patching, skim coating, and running plaster crown molding. Additionally, participants have the opportunity to earn their EPA Renovation, Repair, and Painting Certified Renovator certificate as part of this workshop.

March 26th-29th, 2015 Wood Window Rehabilitation Workshop Fire Station 5 – 519 Douglas Avenue Kalamazoo

A free, four-day workshop on the fundamentals of repair and rehabilitation of wood double-hung windows. Trainees will work with traditional building materials under the guidance of trained preservation craftspeople and will learn the skills of re-roping, replacing a broken pane of glass, weatherstripping, and lead-safe paint removal techniques.
