Saginaw Major Case Unit investigates Shooting, Seizes Illegal Firearms

SAGINAW, MICH. Michigan State Police troopers and Saginaw City Police officers responded to a report of shots fired in the area of 2700 Capehart Drive in Saginaw about 7:50 p.m. on March 23, 2022. Saginaw County Central Dispatch advised multiple 911 callers reported hearing over 40 gunshots.

Preliminary investigation indicates the residence had sustained numerous bullet holes. Contact was made with occupants of the residence and several males aged 16-20 years old were inside. One 19-year-old male of Saginaw suffered a gunshot to the leg and was transported to a local hospital for treatment of his non-life-threatening injuries. No other injuries were reported.

MSP Major Case Unit (MCU) detectives responded and served a search warrant at the residence. Officers seized approximately 10 guns including AK and AR style rifles, several pistols, high-capacity magazines, along with approximately \$1000 cash and a quantity of narcotics.

The partnership between Saginaw Police Department and the Michigan State Police continue to make an impact on violent crime in the City of Saginaw. This incident is an excellent example of the cooperation between agencies responsible for protecting Saginaw's residents.
