Mark Davidson declined to prosecute a motorist who killed a bicyclist on September 16, 2025.

5. Consideration of the sufficiency of the recall petition submitted by Brenda DeKuiper against Noelle Moeggenberg. Reason(s) for recall printed on the petition:

Noelle Moeggenberg failed to secure complete sexually transmitted infection testing of a defendant, victim under 13, on July 3, 2025. Noelle Moeggenberg failed to consult with the victim regarding a plea on June 13, 2025. Noelle Meggenberg failed to investigate sexually transmitted disease present in 4 year old female victim on June 3, 2025. Noelle Moeggenberg failed to investigate allegations made by 4 year old sexual assault victim reporting sexual videos made by a convicted sex offender on August 25, 2025. Noelle Moeggenberg

entered into a plea deal of 0-9 months for Assault with Intent to Commit Sexual Penetration, dropping 2 charges of Criminal Sexual Conduct II, victim under 13, on June 13, 2025. Noelle Moeggenberg failed to investigate a deadly crash prior to entering into a plea on March 20, 2025. Noelle Moeggenberg failed to consult with the victim's family regarding a plea on March 20, 2025. Noelle Moeggenberg agreed to a plea of 2 counts of reckless driving causing serious impairment of a body function, dropping one count of reckless driving causing death on March 20, 2025.
