WHEREAS: The United States of America must be the land of opportunity for all of its citizens, where basic

human dignity is placed at the forefront of our policies and decision-making; and

WHEREAS: Nearly one-third of working age adults in the United States have a criminal record; and

WHEREAS: Individuals returning from prison and those who have paid their debt after committing a crime,

face significant barriers; and

WHEREAS: Individuals with criminal histories often struggle to find housing, employment or education, regain

voting rights, volunteer in their communities, and have to pay for significant debts that arise as a

result their convictions and incarcerations; and

WHEREAS: The Council of State Governments reports that there are more than 48,000 documented social

stigmas and legal restrictions that inhibit building full, productive lives after paying a debt to

society; and

WHEREAS: A robust coalition of business, congregations, and other organizations across the country have

celebrated Second Chance Month since April 2017 through events, Second Chance 5k, briefings,

social media campaigns, advocacy, public awareness, and other activities; and

WHEREAS: Second Chance Month increases public awareness about the need for closure for those who have

paid their debts, and creates opportunities for individuals, employers, congregations, and

communities to extend second chances.  $\,$
