

Program Overview:

Anishinaabe Endaad is a structured and supportive sober living environment that seeks to promote successful reentry and long term life-changes in Native American men by focusing on recovery, community , and culture.

The newly refurbished 2700 square foot home is clean, comfortable, and calm — a supportive and homey atmosphere in which clients can build sober, fulfilling and productive lives. Located just a block from a rapid transit bus line in the Victory neighborhood of Minneapolis, the home is within minutes of jobs, educational opportunities, healthcare, substance abuse treatment, and therapy clinics.

The program aims to support a healthy, grounded lifestyle through connections with housemates going through similar experiences and with professionals trained in providing culturally responsive, trauma-informed care.

Case Management / Wrap Around Services

Anishinaabe Endaad is more than just a place to live. Through a partnership between Red Lake and Avivo, the home becomes a service rich living environment in which residents are actively propelled toward healthy and productive lifestyles.

Avivo will be onsite regularly to provide professional, culturally informed case management services. Visits from their case manager will ensure that the men in the house have access to the support, accountability, and guidance that will support a successful transition to independence.

Case Management Services Include: Assessment and case planning, advocacy, care coordination, monitoring and support, crisis evaluation and assistance, and connection to community wellness and social activities.

Program Highlights

- Clean, comfortable and attractively furnished, with all of the amenities of a home
- Located in a convenient and welcoming neighborhood one block from rapid transit
- Close to employment opportunities, shopping, and support services
- Housing Support (GRH) pays rent for eligible residents
- Extended programming available to residents as long as they wish to stay

Eligibility

- Adult (18+) Men
- Native American affiliation (enrolled or descendant of any Tribe)
- Has completed primary DOC treatment program
- Willing to follow aftercare recommendations, CM case plan, and rules of probation
- Agrees to 20 hours of structured activity (school, job training, volunteer work, etc.)
