- Connect with and establish ongoing relationships with families
- Serve as an advocate with each of your students and his/her/their stakeholders and school-related services (IEP meetings, conferences, social agencies, etc.)
- Collaborate as an active member of the Care Team (social worker and counselors) to provide school-wide social emotional programming

- Monitoring/help with oversight of our food shelf and clothing closet
- Connect with other organizations/community partners to meet the needs of our students and families that extend beyond the scope of the school's resources
- Perform outreach to grow and strengthen current and new community partnerships
- Connect to internal resources and create strategies collaboratively with teachers,
 Student Success Coordinators, and the Care Team for maintaining engagement
- Contact students through phone calls, texts, emails, and home visits as needed
