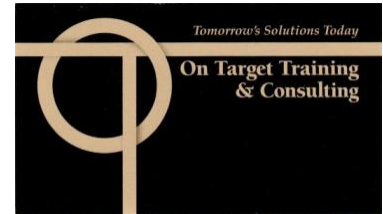


On Target Training: ARMER End-User Radio Trainer (Train the Trainer) Initial

- ☐ Time required: 16 hours (2 days)
- ☐ **Course Deliverables:** 2-day training classes provided to students for their use in delivering ARMER End User radio training to others. Training is designed to cover the ARMER system, including basic characteristics and functionality. The instruction will also include subscriber functionality on the system. Students are provided with certification of course completion and POST certification where applicable.
