

Legalizing Adult-use Cannabis

Minnesotans are asking the Legislature to safely and responsibly legalize adult-use cannabis. House File 600 establishes a new system of responsible regulation and begins to repair the legacy of racial injustice created by the failed criminalization of cannabis.



Establishes Responsible Regulation

A responsibly regulated cannabis market is safer than an underground one. Our approach will address legitimate concerns around youth access, public health, and road safety, and generate new tax revenue to help Minnesota build back better from the pandemic.



Addresses Racial Disparities

Legalizing adult-use cannabis will help address criminal justice inequities created by our current system. Instead of enforcing low-level cannabis offenses, law enforcement could focus on more serious issues.



Improves the Medical Cannabis Program

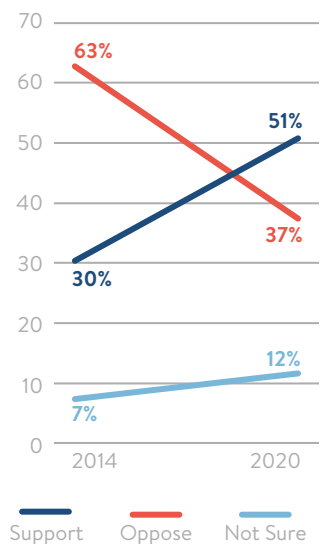
Minnesotans are telling us that our state's existing medical program doesn't work well for most people. House File 600 improves access and affordability for Minnesotans who live with serious illnesses such as cancer, seizures, and chronic pain.



Helps Veterans

Most veterans cannot access or afford medical cannabis, and no vets can legally receive it from the VA. Making cannabis legal for all adults will provide these veterans with better access to a substance that can alleviate their pain and help them cope with PTSD.
