Prior to her work at DRC, Ms. Burnside worked as an Outreach Director at Educators for Excellence, where she was instrumental in organizing teachers to use their voice and their stories to make changes in education for more equitable outcomes for students and families. Ms. Burnside, is a graduate of the University of Minnesota and has 12 years of experience working in the Roseville Area School District with Special Education student scholars and as the Restore Room Coordinator at the Roseville Area Middle School. Ms. Burnside previously served as the President of Conflict Resolution Minnesota's Twin Cities Chapter, and is a contributing member of (Re)Imagining Justice for Youth Initiative in Ramsey County and is a member of the Collaborative Review Team that resulted from that initiative.
