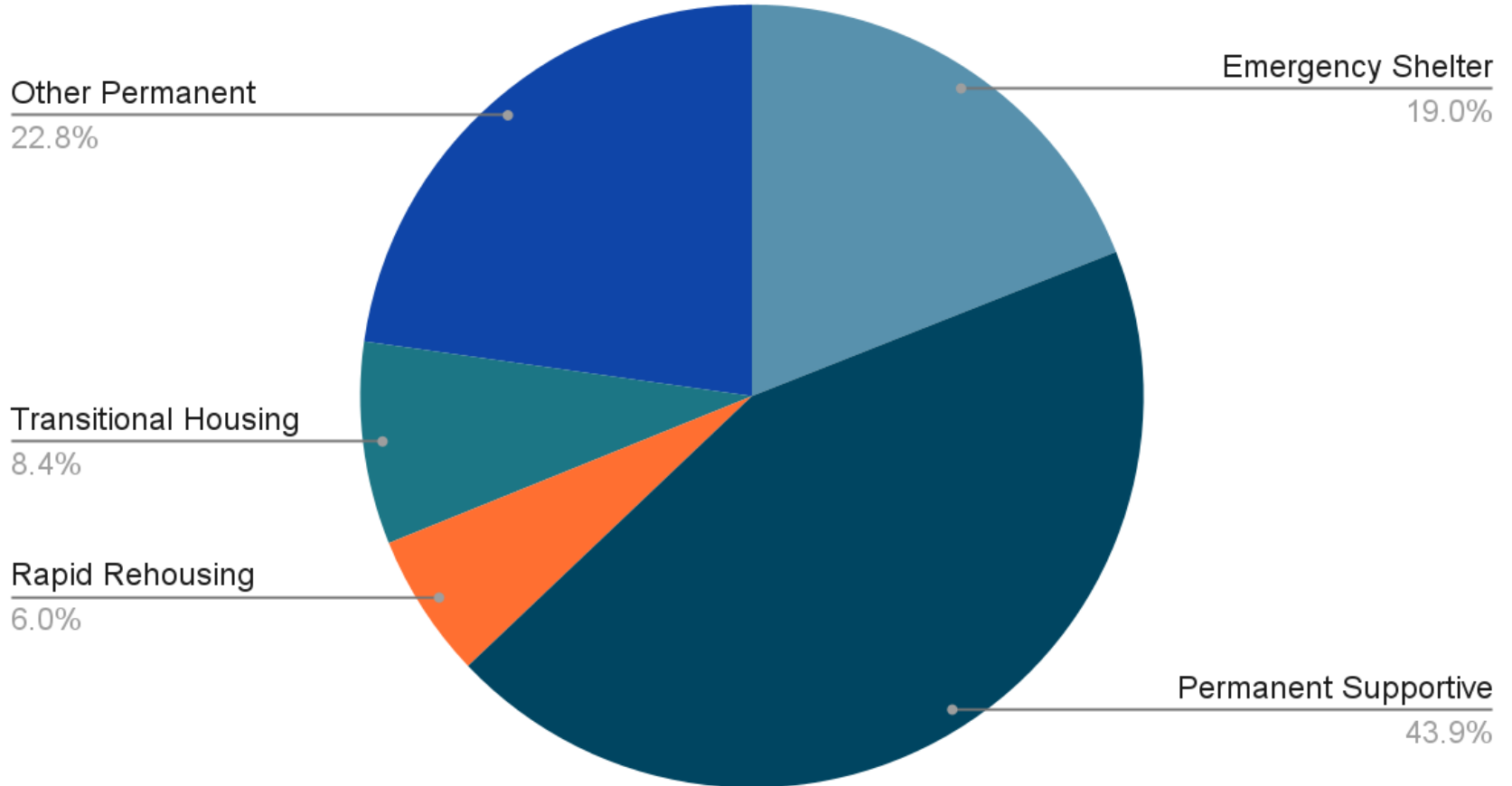
What can the HIC tell us?

- Which beds are being filled most efficiently?
- What types of data quality issues are our providers facing?

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Takeaways:

- Housing Support and Transitional Housing beds are some of the most difficult program models in which to fill beds
- Agency data does not match HMIS data and data in HMIS is largely not complete
- We are in need of hundreds more rental assistance subsidies (aka HIC beds)
